 Andrew Irwin of third creek in the County of Rowan in the State of N. Carolina Planter, being very sick in weak in body but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be unto God, then calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain my last will & test that is to say principally & first I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God who made it, & to spare full & free pardon & forgiveness through merits & passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ, & to give it everlasting life & my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executor or executors named. Nothing doubting but at the resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. As touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner.

I give & bequeath these debts & duties as I do owe in sight & conscience to any person or persons, in any manner whatever, when well & truly contented & paid or ordained to be paid at convenient time after my decease by my executor hereafter.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving brother in law John Graham my stud horse.
 Item I give & bequeath to my brother John Irwin one son & his daughter Jane my black & white cow & calf.
 Item I give & bequeath to my brother William Irwin ten dollars in cash.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving sisters Margaret McClellan & Sarah Lambie ten dollars each to buy them a gown & pair of shoes.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving brother Christopher Irwin one dollar & his daughter Jane one hundred acres of land lying along side of his one, or he may keep the land & give her two hundred dollars which he pleases.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving sister Mary Cowan the note I have on Alexander Cowan her husband & ten dollars in cash.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving brother George Irwin one dollar & his son Christopher ten dollars in cash.
 Item I give & bequeath to my loving brother Thomas Irwin a suit of my best clothes.
 Item I give & bequeath to my Nephew William Graham my saddle & bridle & his choice of my rifle guns & accoutrements.
 Item I give & bequeath to my nephew James Graham one cow & calf.
 Item I give & bequeath to my nephew Christopher Graham the other rifle guns.

I give & bequeath to my loving sister Jane Graham all
right of my estate real & personal, not above mentioned to her
husband & she may sell the land to pay the other legacies
lastly I nominate & ordain & appoint my loving brother, in
law Richard Graham, my whole executor to this my last
& test, and I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all
my other former test: wills & legacies & bequeaths, ratifying
confirming this & no other to be my last will & test. In
