1760 In the Name of God Amen the 30<sup>th</sup> Day of Sept<sup>r</sup> one thou-  
sand seven hundred sixty nine, I Andrew McConrad of  
Rowan County being sick in Body but of perfect Mind & Memory  
thanks be given to God: therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my  
Body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and  
afterward the Judgment to make & ordain this my last Will & Tes-  
tament first & principally of all I give & bequeath my soul into  
the Hand of God who gave it and my Body I recommend to the  
Earth to be buried in a Christian Manner at the Discretion of my  
Executors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I  
shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as  
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless  
me with in this Life I give & devise & dispose of in the following  
Manner and Form viz. Imprimis It is my Will and Pleasure  
that all my lawfull Debts and funeral Charges be paid before  
any Division be made. Next I nominate constitute & appoint  
my dearly beloved Wife Jane and my Brother John McConrad  
Executors of this my last Will & Testament, as is here bequeathen.  
I give & bequeath to Jane my dearly beloved Wife <sup>at present</sup> gray man  
named Mags. & her Saddle before any Division be made, & after-  
wards her equal share of my moveable Estate with my Children  
both male & female, and also it is my Will & Pleasure that my be-  
loved Wife have the Use of <sup>the</sup> plantation to her use & the childrens  
during her <sup>widowhood</sup> & that my Children may be well schooled,  
at the Discretion of my Executors. I give & bequeath unto my beloved  
sons John & Andrew, the place wheresome I now dwell to be equally divided  
between them when Andrew comes to y<sup>e</sup> age of twenty one years, to them  
their heirs & assigns forever. I give & bequeath to my wife beloved child  
Dear Miss Mary, Jane, John, Andrew, Margaret, & to her who whom my Wife is  
now with child all being on an equal share of my personal Estate to them  
their heirs & assigns forever, except what is above bequeathen to my wife  
Andrew McConrad

1763 In the Name of God Amen The twenty fifth Day of April in  
the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty eight I Andrew  
McConrad of the Parish of Saint Luke in the County of Rowan and  
Province of North Carolina do last will & testament being very weak weak in  
Body but of perfect Mind & Memory Thanks be given to God therefore  
calling to mind the Mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appoin-  
ted for all men once to die I do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament  
that is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into  
the Hands of God that gave it & for my Body I recommend it to the Earth  
to be buried in a Christian like Manner at the Discretion of my heirs and  
Executors Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive  
the same again by the almighty Power of God and as touching such  
worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this  
Life with I give devise and dispose of the same in the following man-  
ner & Form that is to say. First I do give will and bequeath  
to my loving Wife one third part of my moveable Estate when paid to  
be paid her by my heirs and Executors. Secondly I do give will & bequeath  
to my four Daughters Margaret Jane Elizabeth and Ann six parts of  
Pennsylvania Money when of the Age of eighteen and if any of them  
should die before of that Age her or their Shares to be equally divided be-  
tween the Survivors. Thirdly I do give will & bequeath to my son  
twenty pounds like Money but if he should die before he is of the  
age of twenty this shall not be paid. Fourthly I do give will  
my son John an equal part with my son James in all  
the Year Old Horse Coll which is now John own Property  
is under my hand by purchase of his own. Fifthly I  
bequeath to my son James an equal part with John  
constitute appoint make and ordain him my sole heir  
of this my last Will and Testament & all & singular the  
things therein his heirs and assigns forever and
