my estate both real & personal during her life: & at the death of
my beloved wife, whatever may remain of my estate shall then
be sold at reasonable credit & equally divided amongst my
children. I further will that my beloved wife shall not give
to any of my children any thing during her life, without it
being first appraised. And should such gifts of my wife to any
of my children amount to more than an equal share at her
death, then such children are to pay up the difference so
that each child is to share alike. I further will that my
executors may sell any part of my estate, real or personal
at public or private sale as they can make suit best to raise
money sufficient to discharge my debts. Lastly I appoint
Charles Mills & Thomas Reeves executors of this my last
will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set

my hand & seal this 31st day of August A.D. 1802.

I hereby make & ordain my worthy friend Philip's Beck jun
Fanny Payne my wife executors of this my last will & test &
in witness whereof I the said Charles Payne have to this my last
will & test: set my hand & seal the day & year above written.
