tling my Secular affairs, Do <sup>therefore</sup> make this my last  
Will & Testament in the form & manner following,

Viz I pray that all my lawful Debts shall  
be paid out of my estate by my Executor herein af-  
ter ~~named~~ <sup>named</sup> them I do hereby appoint & declare by  
beloved friend James Gress to be my sole Executor of  
this my said Will & do empower him to receive & collect  
& pay of the Debts now due or that may become due to  
me & to settle & pay the persons to whom I am justly  
indebted. Item that all the Residue of my estate I do  
hereby bequeath to the said James Gress to be ap-  
plied to his own use as he may think proper &  
I do hereby revoke all and every other <sup>former</sup> Will & Testament by  
me made & do declare this to be my last Will & Testament.

In the name of God Amen I do hereby  
of the County of Rowan and state of North Carolina, being  
mindful of the frailty and Mortality of Human nature  
and that it is appointed for all men once to die, but  
considering the uncertainty of life and my now being  
in perfect mind and memory and understanding, I  
do make this my last Will and Testament in manner  
form following: First and principally I recommend  
my soul into the hands of God that gave it and I recommend  
my Body to the Earth to be Buried decently at the discre-  
tion of my Executor hereafter by me named in view and  
certain hope that it will raise again. Through the Almight-  
-ly power of our saviour Jesus Christ, and as for such  
Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with  
I do give bequeath and dispose of in the following manner  
and form — FIRST I give Will and bequeath to  
my Beloved Wife Margaret Smith power to use occupy  
and enjoy the Manner plantation, and Mills, both Great  
Mill and Saw Mill, Together with all my Houses and  
Cattle, Waggon and Sheep and all my Household furniture  
and plantation Tools which plantation contains two  
hundred and Twelve Acres, and the two Negro men  
Nava named Joe and Friday, and one Negro Wench  
named Kagar, and an equal part of all the Ready  
Money now in my possession (During her Widowhood  
to help her to raise the younger Children, and  
to school them, and when my Youngest child

60) Philip Smith <sup>whose</sup> eye is of the age of Twenty One  
Years that the Negroes Men Slaves shall be Valued and my  
Children shall have all an Equal share, But the Wench  
is to remain to my Wife during her life, and then to be  
Valued both her and her increase, and to be equally  
divided amongst all my Children, And shall my Wife  
have One third part of all my moveable Estate, and to be  
paid Twelve pounds Current Money of this State Yearly  
out of my Estate and to find her fire for One Cow and  
Horse during her life And secondly when my son Phillip  
is of age his Plantation and Mills is to go to my sons  
Gasper & Phillip and to be Valued, and all my Chil-  
dren is to have an Equal share, Which which several  
sums they shall pay to the rest of my Heirs Thirdly  
I give Will and Bequeath to my eldest son George Smith  
the Plantation or Tract of Land lying on Abbe's Creek  
(and joining the Mill Tract containing Two Hundred  
and Twenty five Acres for ever, And Sorrell Mare  
English Blooded, and the Mare & Plantation are to  
be Valued, and he shall pay to the rest of his Brothers  
And Sisters an equal Share with himself —  
Fourthly, Give Will and Bequeath my four Daughters  
Margaret, Barbara, Christina and Mary and equal  
share of my moveable Estate with their Brothers, as  
also an equal out of the Value of my real Estate —  
Barbara is to have one <sup>English</sup> Blooded Sorrel Mare known  
by the name of Barbara Mare, and Margaret

Margaret is to have one Yellow Mare, English Blooded  
Which Mares are to be Valued and to be a part of their  
Share, and my son George is to have Raffle which  
is not to be Valued, And to this my last Will  
and Testament I constitute make ordain and  
Appoint my sole Executors My Beloved Wife Mar-  
garet Smith, and my Brother in Law David  
Smith. But if my Wife doth Marry then her  
right of Executor shall cease
