Lastly I name & constitute & appoint my dearly beloved
wife Sarah Brandon, to execute this my last will & test
herby revoke, & disannull all former wills, testaments, bequests,
legacies & executors, by her in any manner of ways before
this time written & bequeathed, or appointed, ratifying this
to be my last will & test. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal the year & day above
written.
