

In the name of God Amen I Conrad Bullon of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina, being very sick & weak in body but of sound mind & memory Thanks be to God for it, & all other mercies, calling to mind the mortality of my body do make & ordain this my last will & Testament, first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my executors, & as touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise & dispose of the same in the manner & form as followed (Viz)

Firstly I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Magdalena her bed & spinning wheel as a dower to keep for ever further I will that my said wife shall keep so long as she will remain my widow the following articles Viz one horse creature the choice of all, two cows & one heifer & all the puter, knife & forks & all kind of house furniture or such part as she want to keep after with all my moveable property shall be sold by my after named executor & my just debts paid, my said wife shall also have the use of my plantation as long as she remains my widow, now in case my wife shall marry again, she shall surrender up my plantation to my executors, or to my two sons Charles & John Bullon, and also all the above mentioned articles, or such part as she will keep shall be sold after she marries again by the after

named executors & the whole equally divided amongst my said wife & my two sons Charles & John Bullon share & share alike Secondly I give & bequeath to my two beloved sons Charles & John my house & plantation & all my land to have & to hold for ever; to be equally divided amongst them or their heirs & assigns. The said land shall be divided after my two sons arrives to the age of twenty one years so as they can agree among themselves And I do hereby constitute & appoint my truly friend Peter Funder son: executor of this my last will & test: & I hereby revoke all former wills, ratifying & renouncing this & no other to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 15 day of July A.D. 1805.

The nuncupative will of Philip Bullon deceased. January 28th 1794 Declared in perfect senses & memory it is his last will, that his wife & George Bullon should be his lawful executors & that they should as much of his estate as will satisfy all just debts & the remainder of his estate, it is his will, his widow should keep the support herself & his children, during the time she shall live & widow but if she should marry or after her death, it is his will that all his property shall be sold at public sale equal divided amongst them.
