I recommend my soul to God & my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life I dispose of the same as follows: First I give to Catharina my dear beloved wife the half of my moveable estate, & a peaceable possession of my dwelling house & land for as long as she lives, Secondly I make over to her, her bed, & dresser with all the plates & the roan horse, saddle & bridle, also I give to my brother's son Henry Frock the sum of ten pounds in gold or silver N<sup>c</sup> Carolina money, to be risid out of my estate, together with all my household goods, debts, & moveable estate. Also I give Henry Lamby the half of my personal estate, land & ornaments for which said Henry Lamby is to maintain Catharina, my beloved wife as long as she lives as a widow. Likewise I give over to John Lamby the other half of my land & said Henry Lamby is to give him fifteen pounds, Likewise I give over to Conrad Ritchie and Conrad Lobwasser & Conrad Eller each of them three pounds for the schooling. Likewise I give over to Joseph Lamby & Jacob Lamby & Philip's Lamby & Elizabeth Lamby the other half of my moveable estate. I likewise constitute; make & ordain George Bullard, & Frederick Grimmer, executors of this my last will & test: And I do hereby utterly disavow & revoke all former test: wills, legacies & executors, ratifying
