to God and willing to mind the mortality of my body
and that I am appointed for all men once to die do
make and make in this to be my last will and Testament
Solemnly and first of all I give and Recommend
My soul to the Hands of God that have it to me and
my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a
Decent and Christian manner at the Discretion of
My friends nothing doubting but at the General Resur-
rection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God and in touching such worldly goods as I
have pleased God to bless me with, I Give Devise and
Bequeath of in manner and form as followeth.

Item I will and devise that my beloved wife Mary
have her maintenance on the premises when I shall
Live during her widowhood and no longer
I will and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary one
Small mare which is called her Riding mare and
One feather bed and bedding and all my stock of
Cattle that I own my two work horses and coopers
and all the rest of my moveable Estate I leave to
Be for the Use of my wife and her two children Mary
and John on the place.

Item I will and Bequeath unto my beloved
Son Thomas Enocks one Entry of Land containing
Three hundred and fifty Acres more or less lying on
an Bryan mill Creek.

Item I will and Bequeath unto my son
David Enocks one hundred Acres of divided land within

I now live including the Improvements to wit
An addition beginning at a Corner hereby the
Ford of the Creek between me and Isaac Enocks
and running a straight line by the north end
of the said field to Bryan's line. I under the long
San Thomas and my son David purchase one
Hundred and fifty Acres of Good land for my
Son John Enocks when he comes to eighteen
Years of age and did the same for him.

And what paper money I have I leave to them
For that use.

Item I will and bequeath unto my beloved
Daughters Susanna Rebeckah Eliza and Ann
The sum of five shillings apiece to each of them
When they shall demand the same and all here
and Cattle that is belonging to each child is to be their
Own property hereof life. I Devise that James
Helson have the privilege of living when he now
Lives and at the same terms as he now does until
ill my son David arrives to twenty one years
of age if he survive.

Item I have to state and appoint my
Well Beloved wife Mary Enocks and Eva Miller
Executor of this my last will and Testament
In witness whereof I have unto set my
Hand and seal this 22nd Day of October 1791

Between my son Thomas and my son. My son
For Thomas provided he will give his to John

In the Name of God Amen I William Bryan of
The County of Kentuckey being in low Estate of health, but of
Sound mind and perfect memory (Thank God) And Calong to
Mind my mortality and to prevent disputes that may
Arise after my Death to dispose of those earthly things
With whicheth hath pleased God bless me to make and ordain
This to be my last Will and Testament in manner and
Form following, Viz

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Bryan
One thousand acres Land which I purchased off of John
Bryan, lying between Bain Run and the North fork of
Elkhorn Creek in Lintackery County, it being part
of a settlement and prescription due unto J. Bryan
In consideration of Raising a brood of hore in the County of
Kentuckey in the year 1776 at the direction of my wife
To take what part of the land she pleases, I also Give unto
My said wife three Negroes to wit one woman named del
bey and two men named James and Sasser, also four
Horses, one cart and mare called Blay, one team horse
called broken, one big station and one big salt out of
a mare called blackstock, and all the house hold and
Fitching, furniture, plantations utensils and some
plow and of husbandry for to her and her heirs
and assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Samuel Bryan
One Negro woman due to me from John Hawkins of the
State of N. Carolina to him and his heirs and assigns
for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Daniel Bryan all
The rest of land not already given and on Negro man
named John, and one cart, station and all my smith
and Carpenters tools to him and his & assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Phebe Bryan
Three horse kind now called Sars and one Negro boy named
George and two horse called Sars to her and her
heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Hannah
Bryan one Negro girl named Rachel one Negro
boy called Sars, two cows, and now called to her and
her heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Bryan
One Negro girl named Sars, and one gangrened mare
and one whole heffer to her and her heirs and assigns
for ever.

Item All the money due to me from John Hawkins of
The State of N. Carolina I Give and Bequeath unto
My children Samuel, Daniel, Phebe, Hannah, Sarah
Elizabeth and Mary share and share alike to them
and their and assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
All the Remainder of my estate of cattle hogs and
sheep, to her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

Item all the rest of my estate not already given of
at hand never I Give to all my children share
share alike to them and their heirs and assigns for
ever.
