my Daughters Jane and Agnes so much in
Money as make them equal with the portion
I gave to Isabella, and the Remainder of my
Estate to be likewise equally divided amongst
my Children. ~~And~~ Lastly I constitute

and appoint Robert Ramsay and James ¹⁷³
Kerr of Rowan County in said State and
Thomas Bantley late of the City of Philadelphia
to be my lawful Executors. I that they the
said Robert Ramsay and James Kerr on obtai-
ning a Clearance by Bond or otherwise from
him the said Thomas Bantley, shall forever
hereafter remain free and clear from the Liabilities
of said Estate, and this I ordain as my last
Will and Testament Sealed with my seal
and dated this 30th Day of June 1780.
