I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Miss M^{rs} Minnie the sum of five pounds lawful Money of North Carolina. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Hannah Chrisman the sum of five pounds lawful Money of North Carolina. I give and bequeath unto my two younger Sons John and Joseph all the Rest of my real and personal Estate after their Mothers Estate of the Kind is reduced to be equally divided in manner following, it is my Will that my younger Son Joseph shall possess and enjoy the tract of Land situate on Silver Creek which I purchased from my Son Charles and also that my Executors shall purchase out of my Estate a Tract of Land for my Son J^r to the Value of sixty pounds of lawful Money of North Carolina & the Remainder to be equally divided between my two younger Sons J^r and Joseph and in case either die under under Age I appoint the Survivor to be his Heir.

Now, I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved Wife
 Margaret and Sons Hugh and Charles Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament, and hereby revoke and repudiate all
 former Wills and Testaments, ratifying and confirming this
 to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my Hand & affixed my Seal this
 sixteenth Day of March, in the Year of our Lord one thousand
 hundred & seventy.

 his heirs forever And my Will is that my Son James Mabry is to
 take Care of my beloved Daughter Susa wearing of her Life as she
 is not able to take Care of herself. And my Will is further that after my
 Wifes Decease or the Day of her Marriage which shall first happen
 that all my houshold Goods two feather Beds and Furniture and
 all my Stock of Horses and Mares and Cattle and Hogs to be sold
 by my son James Mabry & the Money so raised my Son James
 to pay all my just debts out of that Money & raise and the
 over plus to be equally divided among my Daughters Susa
 North Jackson and Ruthe Carter and Sarah Williams and

Aug: 1st In the Name of God, amen I John McPeters of Rowan County and Province of North Carolina being wake in body, but of sound Memory (Glory be God to make and publish this my last Will and Testament in Manner following (that is to say) I give I give and bequath my Soul unto Almighty God he gave it me and my Body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors. I then I bequath to my beloved Wife Mary four Cows & their four calves likewise I give to my said Wife two Mares viz. one bay Mare named Phasun branded on the near hind Leg with W, and one bright bay Mare branded on the near Shoulder with a Buttick thus I M. Likewise I give to my said Wife her Dress & Tricots and all her wearing Apparel. I then I give and bequath to my Daughter Margret one young bright bay mare one year old branded on the near Shoulder and Buttick thus I M. Also I give and bequath to my Daughter Mary one year old gray mare branded on the near Shoulder and Buttick thus I M. I then I give if it please God that my Wife is safely delivered of the Child that she is now with and if said Child should be a man Child I give and bequath to said son the Third of Land in what I now live, and if the said Child should be a woman Child I give that if aforesaid Part of Land be equally divided between my above said Daughter

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shar and share alike. I then I give my Plantation on which I live to my Wife Mary & her Heirs to live and live upon until my above said Daughter Margret McPeters comes of Age and no longer she making no Trade or Destruction thereupon I then I order and decree that my lawful Debts be honestly paid out of the remaining part of my movable Estate & what is remaining of said Estate to be equally divided between my Wife and three surviving Sons & share alike, and I make and ordain her my said Wife and George Henry my true & lawful sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, in Trust for the Intents & purposes in in this Will contained. In Witness whereof I the said John McPeters have to this my last Will & Testament set my Hand and Seal this 1st day of November 1775 signed sealed and delivered in presence of us who were present at the signing and sealing thereof

Jan: 1st In the Name of God Amen this twenty-sixth Day December in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & seventy I Henry McHenry of Rowan County in the Province of North Carolina being very sick and weak of Body but of perfect Mind & Memory Thanks be given to God for the same & calling to mind the Mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in Name & Form as followeth that is to say principally I give & bequath my Soul to the Hands of God who give it and for my Body I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God And as touching the movable Estate which hath pleased God to bless me with I bequath as followeth in the first place I give
