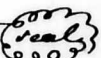

unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my
last will & test: that is to say principally of all I recommend
my soul into the hands of God, who gave it & my body to the
earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my executors, & as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it had pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise &
dispose of the same in the following manner & form -

First I give to my well beloved wife daughter Martha's the
sum of five shillings of lawfull money of N. Carolina
to be raised out of my estate & with all my just debts to
be paid. Also I give to my well beloved wife Ann Hunter
whome I likewise constitute make & ordain the sole executrix
of this my last will & test: all and singular my land, tenements
& tennements by her freely to be possessed & enjoyed, dur-

her lifetime, then my lands I give to my brother Ellick. Son
John Hunter to him & his heirs, ^{to} fully begethen of body
And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all & every
other former test: wills, legacies, bequeaths, & executors, by me
in any wise before named, wished, & bequeathed, ratifying &
confirming this & no other to be my last will & test: in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
1st day of November 1794.

in the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina (Surrey Smith)
made this 7 day of April 1789. Witnessed.

Item I give bequeath & devise unto my loving wife Nancy
Thorak all & singular my household furniture, my mare
& her saddle, two cows, the house & lot whereon I now live, during
her widowhood & no longer; but of my said said wife should
prefer living on a tract of land I purchased of the publick
formerly the property of Henry Eustace M. Cullock Esq?
I wish she may have it during her widowhood as aforesaid.
My will & pleasure further is. I do give & bequeath unto
my daughter Elizabeth the house & lot whereon I now live

also one lot in the town of Salisbury aforesaid being part of N^o: Eight & Sixteen in the South square of said town also one hundred acres of Land in said County on the Waters of Crane Creek, including my meadow, also I will that the tract of Land I purchased at publick sale, formerly the property of Henry Eusden, M^r Cullock Esq: when & title is obtained be the property of my daughter Elizabeth aforesaid.

Further my will & desire is that the residue of my estate be sold to pay my lawfull debts, my funeral expences & the cost of proving this my last will & test: And if any thing remains after my debts are paid to be left in the hands of my wife Nancy to enable her to maintain her daughter Elizabeth.

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint John Hampton & James Brandon, both my loving friends, executors of this my last will & test: hereby revoking all other wills by me made & executors by me appointed declaring this & this only as my last will & test: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal in the presence of the subscribers the Day & year first before mentioned.

In the name of God Amen! I Mary Hardman of the County of Rowan & State of N^o: Carolina being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed one for all flesh to die & after death to come to Judgment. Do make this my last will & test: in maner & form following that is to say. First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it & my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named & touching such temporal estate as it had pleased God to bestow upon me in this life. I give & dispose thereof in the following manner & form. First I will that my debt & funeral charges shall be paid & discharged. I bequeath to my dearly beloved son George Hardman one cow & calf & one steer & twenty two dollars in cash I bequeath to my dearly beloved daughter Elizabeth one iron pot & one skillet, all the rest & residue of my estate I bequeath to my son James Hardman, Peter, George, Henry Hardman & Rachel, Mary, Christina, Patsy, Hannah, Elizabeth Hardman to be equally divided between them. And I do hereby revoke, disannul & make void all former wills & test: by me heretofore made: In witness whereof I the said Mary Hardman do acknowledge this my last will & test: In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 24th Day of February 1806. I do appoint George Hardman & my son Henry Hardman as executors of my estate.
