Memory thinks he given unto god & calling to mind my mor  
tality & that I appointed for men to die so therefore make this  
my last will & testament of principally & first of all giving  
& recommend my soul into the hands of god that governs  
having the merit with & intercession of my Lord & Savior J  
esus Christ to have a full & plenарy pardon & forgiveness of all my  
earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of  
my executors hereafter named nothing doubting but to  
rein the same again at the general resurrection by the mis  
tly power of god & as touching such worldly estate whereunto  
it has pleased god to call me with in this life I give & bequeath  
unreservedly of in the following manner & form viz  
it is my will & pleasure that all those just debts and  
do owe to any manner of persons <sup>persons</sup> or otherwise whomsoever  
first of all paid & satisfied by my executors here after named in  
some convenient time after my death Item I give & bequeath  
to my well beloved wife Rachael my grey horse & the bed  
& furniture there unto belonging that goes by her name

With all & singler her wearing apparel & all other articles  
I received with her now ~~marriage~~ to her her heirs & assigns  
for ever also her right & title of owner of in the plantation  
I live on for during the natural life. Item I give & bequeath  
to my loving son Robert Hughay my negro called  
Samson, & his land money as it now passes in the  
aforesaid state or the equal value thereof in paper money  
of State & my large Bible to him his heirs & assigns  
for ever. Item I give & bequeath to my grand  
children viz. the Captain of my deceased son Samuel  
Hughay my negroman named Jack, and my little  
negro wench named Jude which is now in the posse  
sion of that family to be equally divided among  
the said children and to their heirs & assigns forever  
Item I give & bequeath 40 miles unto my beloved  
son Harry Hughay my Mulatto boy called Peter  
my negro wench called Jude 6 fifty Acres of land  
to be laid off of my plantation wheron I now live  
along his own line Beginning begining at the  
Crack & running north to the east & west bound  
dry ~~line~~ line of my s<sup>t</sup> plantation for comple  
ment, and also my longgon & gears to him his  
heirs & assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath and  
desist to my loving son Jacob Hughay my Negro  
boy called Andy and the plantation wheron  
I now live the fifty Acres herein above desisted

54 to my son Henry accepted, also my d<sup>r</sup> loving  
wife downe as above also accepted and also my  
new settled place joining the former to him and  
to his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give and  
bequeath to my loving son Isaac Hughes five  
shillings money of the said state to him his heirs  
& assigns. Item all the residue & remainder of  
of my estate I give & bequeath to my three  
sons, viz. Robert Henry & Jacob and to the or-  
phary of my deceased son Samuel to be equa-  
lly divided amongst them, the said Bequests  
to have one son, part only, to them & each of  
them their heirs & each of their heirs bequeathed  
lastly I name or again constitute & appoint my  
truly & good friend Samuel Young & my two lov-  
ing sons Robert & Henry Executors of this my last  
will & testament hereby revoking & disavowing  
all & every former and other will, Testament, Be-  
quests, & naming & Executing by me in any man-  
ner of way before this time named wills, be-  
queathed, devised or appointed, ratifying and  
confirming this & no other to be my last will &  
testament. Signed sealed published pronounced &  
accorded by the said Henry Hughes as his last will  
& Testament in presence of us the subjoining witnesses

ing unto mind the mortality of my body and  
knowing that it is appointed for man once to die  
to make and ordane this my last will and Testimony  
that is to say principally & first of all I give & becom-  
-mand my soul into the hands of God that gave it  
hoping through the merits death & passion of my Sa-  
-vor Jesus Christ to have full & free pardon and  
forgiveness of all my sins to live an everlasting  
life, & my body I commit to the earth to be decently  
buried at the discretion of my executors here after  
named, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrec-  
-tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
Power of God. And as touching such worldly estate  
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life  
I give devise & dispose of the same in the follow-  
ing manner & form that is to say First I will that  
all those debts & dues as I do owe in right or con-  
-science to any manner of person or persons what-  
ever shall be wile & truly accounted & paid or re-  
-claimed to be paid in convenient time after my de-
