Province of North Carolina & in the Parish of S. Peter's  
calling to mind the Mortality of my body, being of sound mind and  
Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner & form  
following, Viz. first I Commit my Soul to God who gave it, & my body  
to the Dust to be buried in a Christian Decent form at the Discretion  
of my Executors, and then all my several Charges to be paid, and then  
all my lawful Debts to be discharged & paid, and the Residue of my estate  
that God has blessed me with to be Disposed in the following manner  
first, I will to my Son Cornelius Smith the sum of my homestead planta-  
tion on which I now live in Completion One hundred and fifty five  
Acres to be laid off in manner following, Viz. Beginning at a black  
Jack on Crooketts line near the Meadow Branch running near  
East up the side of the mountain to a white stake there marked, on the  
North End of S<sup>d</sup> Meadow, thence bearing the said side as shall here  
150 Acres, to my Son Andrew Smith and his Heirs forever, and Next  
I give and Devise to my Son Thomas Smith, that Plantation known  
by the Name of Jacobs place on the River containing 200 Acres to  
him and his Heirs forever. — And next I give and Bequeath to  
my true and loving Wife Annate Smith besides her Dower her  
Bed, Bedstead and Bedding and her Chest and Crocker Chair of the  
New and the use of the North of the plantation until Andrew Smith  
comes of Age of twenty one and the Best Room in the House during  
her Widowhood, and provision sufficient for my wife and my children, and  
next I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Catharine the best bedstead and  
bedding bedded harness, and one cow the best she can get after the death, and  
I give and Devise to my Grandson John Busby, the place  
where John Turner and Samuel Freeman & right  
Executors to clear out of the

make him a good Deed for the same when he arrives to the age of twenty one  
years old, but in case he dies before arriving to that age, it shall and I do  
give and Devise it to my Grandson Andrew Smith, and his Heirs forever  
and of the Residue of my I do bequeath to my Son Cornelius Smith  
Twenty Shillings for a Commination Money, and lastly the Residue of my  
Estate to be Equally Divided between my Daughter Rebecca Turner  
Son Thomas Smith Daughter Catharine and Son Andrew Smith  
and I do constitute and appoint my true and Trusty Executors James  
Smith and my Son Thomas Smith as Executors of this my last will and  
Testament, and I do declare Ratify and Confirm this and no other to  
be my last will and Testament in Manner, whereof I have set my  
Hand and affixed my Seal this Twentieth day of December one  
Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy Eight.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved James McNealey the sum of thirteen pounds seven Shillings.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Brother James James the sum of thirteen pounds seven Shillings and likewise my blue suit of Cloaths and two Buckskin Breeches.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Brother John McNealey my Sattout Coach.

It is my Will and I order that my Carpenter and Joiner Tools be sold and the Money there arising be Equally Divided amongst my three Brothers Viz. Arch. McNealey James McNealey & James James and lastly. I do ordain and appoint, my Trusty Brothers John McNealey and Archibell McNealey To be my Executors of this Testament, and I do hereby solemnly direct
