Carolina being sick & weak in body, but of good sound memory thanks be to God, & calling to remembrance the uncertain estate of this my transitory life, & that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please God to call, I do make, constitute, ordain & declare this my last will & test: in manner & form following revoking & annulling by these presents, all & every, test: will: heretofore by me made & declared either by word or writing, & this is to be taken only for my last will & test: & no other. First I give my soul to God & my body to the earth to be decently buried, at the discretion of my executors. As to my worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I dispose of in following manner & form. I will that all my debts to be paid after my decease at a convenient time, by my executors hereafter named. Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Luckey out of my estate besides what I have already given him the sum of ten pounds & no more to him & his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Samuel Luckey all my land lying on the west side of Hunting creek including my improvements whereon I now live & ten pounds currency besides what I have already given him & no more to him, his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I will that all my moveable property that is to say horses, cows, hogs, sheeps, household furniture, & my two negroes named Steve & Dinah shall be put to sale & the money equally divided between my three daughters namely Eleonor McQuire & Ann Luckey & Mary Luckey, only out of such money arising from such property. I give to my granddaughter Ann Roushaw when she comes to the age of sixteen years the sum of five pounds, to them their heirs & assigns forever.

And lastly I do nominate & appoint my son Samuel Luckey & my son in law James McQuire executors of this my last will & testament

A.D. 1800 do make & publish this my last will & test: in following manner. corn & all my farming utensils & all my cotton & flax & wheat & it is further my pleasure that all my moveable estate, except these before mentioned & bequeathed away be sold at public sale by my executors & out of the amount of sale, my just debts & burial charges to be paid & the remainder to remain in the hands of my executors, who I appoint as guardians of the saleable part of my estate & out of the amount of sale I allow my guardians to supply my widow at the end of three years with three dollars & at the end of the fourth year with four dollars & the remainder to be set on interest & equally divided amongst my children as the come of age, & my two sons to be bound by my guardians to beneficial trades. And lastly I do hereby make & ordain Thomas Pinkster & Will^m Link executor of this my last will & test: & I do hereby revoke & disallow all other wills & test: & acknowledge this & no other to be my last will & test: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

In the name of God Amen! this 7th Day of Decr: 1800.
I Elijah Lyon of Roan County & State of N^C Carolina being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God, & calling the mind the mortality of my body & that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will & test: principally & first of all, I give & recommend

my soul to God who gave it & my body to the earth to be buried decently & in a christian, like manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give & bequeath the same in the manner & form following - First it is my will & pleasure that all these just debts as I owe to any persons whomsoever, be well & truly paid & satisfied in some convenient time after my decease by my executors hereafter named.

Item I give & bequeath unto my dear & well beloved wife Nancy Lyon the plantation whereon I now live, the dwelling house, & household furniture & all my stock of cattle, Hogs, Horses, sheeps & four of my negroes, namely, Peter, Barnes, Nelly, & Ann - during her natural life - or during her widowhood & after such alteration, as death or marriage. I give & bequeath to my son Nathan Lyon - these four negroes (that I have already named to my wife during her natural life or widowhood) & their issue, except one negroe girl out of such issue I give & bequeath to my son Richard Lyon, the stock & furniture before mentioned I leave discretionally to my wife to dispose of as she sees proper - to divide among my children. Item I give & bequeath unto my son Richard Lyon one half of my plantation or land to be laid off to him on the east side of my premises & one negroe named Tony & his horse & saddle to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Nathan Lyon, one negroe boy named Steve & no more to him his heirs & assigns for ever.
