Do this 10 Day of April in the year of our Lord 1805 make & publish this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary West. equal share of all my estate with my four younger Children, namely Benjamin West, Nancy West, Sarah West, & Minty West. after the decease of my old wife her part I give to her son John Pinkle - Item I give to my son Wm West & Finney Wicks Catharina Rivins & Isaac West the sum of one Shilling good & lawfull money of the state aforesaid to be paid out of my estate by my executors.

I also make & appoint my said wife Mary West Executor of this my last will & testament my son Benjamin West Executor

In the name of Almighty God Amen! I Jacob Warvil of Rowan County in the State of N. Carolina being in a low State of health but of perfect mind, sound senses, & memory thanks be to God, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do for the purpose of settling all my affairs with every

3. persons & to dispose of my worldly estate which God gave me in this life; to my well beloved wife & children to my own mind. - do this 1. February AD. 1804 make & ordain this to be my last will & testament in the following manner & form.

First it is my will that all my just debts shall be paid & also my funeral Charges.

Secondly. It is my will & I do direct that my well beloved wife Molly shall have a peaceable possession of my houses & plantation during the time she shall remain my widow & I do give to her for her use her bed & furniture to the same & her spinning wheel, two cows her choice, two sheep, windmill & my wagon which I will she shall keep for her use, while she remains my widow but in case she should marry again I do direct that the above mentioned articles which I give to her use shall all be sold by my after named executors. & my said wife shall have a child's part of all my personal estate which I give to her for ever.

Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my son Daniel Warvil for ever my plantation whereon I now live with all the land & appertements belonging to the same upon the following & express terms to wit that he shall pay to his mother during the time she remains my widow yearly one hundred & fifty weight of Bacon fifty Bushels of wheat & twenty Bushels of Corn & shall suffer her to have peaceable possession, during her widowhood or shall otherwise decently support her, & that he shall

moreover pay to his brothers & sisters the just & full sum of four hundred silver dollars money of the United States in six years from this present date. Then when he my said son Daniel complies with the above mentioned condition he shall inherit & enjoy my land for ever & my said son Daniel shall let his mother have hay for her cattle &c. I give unto my daughter Susannah for ever one bed & furniture to the same, one spinning wheel & one heater & one mare which I now own.

5. It is my will & I do direct that my after named executor shall sell all other articles belonging to me which I have not given, at public vendue & the money arising from the same shall be equally divided between my wife & children share & share alike. Excepting so much thereof as will pay the schooling of my daughter Susan for six months, which shall be paid out of my estate. I further direct that my wife may keep & be sworn to her use or any other article she may want and I do hereby constitute & appoint Jacob Fisher my executor of this my will & to do & do hereby revoke all other wills by me made & allow this only to be my last will & test. in witness whereof I Jacob Warbit have hereunto set my hand & signed & sealed this 13th day of Septor 1802.

And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form to wit.

I give & bequeath to Meriam my dearly beloved wife, all & singular my estate both real & personal to her use to possess & enjoy unto ever & I likewise constitute make & ordain my said beloved wife Meriam the sole executrix of this my last will & testament by her jointly to be possessed & enjoy'd in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 13. day of Septor 1802.
