& Province of South Carolina, being very sick & weak in

God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my Body

and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make
Ordain this my last Will & Testament; that is to say principally and first

like & decent Manner, at the Direction of my Executors; not doubting

equally divided between the two Children bought of Hercules Moore
lying at the mouth of Birdins Creek to be possessed by said Samuel and
Joseph Curry when they arrive to the Years of Maturity. I likewise I bequeath
to Dorothy Miller one Mare come of the Mare that was bought of Bluff
Shoemaker by her to be possessed and the Mare to be free from any servitude or
persons whatsoever. And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke & disannul
all & every other Testaments, Wills, & Legacies, Bequests & Executors by me
in any ways before this Time named, willed & bequeathed, ratifying &
confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament, In witness
