Eliza, each of them to have one eighth part thereof.

I nominate constitute & appoint my dearly beloved Wife
Eliza Garrison and my beloved son William Garrison Executors
of my last Will & Testament & my true & lawful
sole Guardian of my Children, with whom I
authorize to advise and be consulted in all matters
concerning the Children's Estate, &c. — Ratifying & confirming
