Codicil to the foregoing Will and Testament made
 by the said John Getchey this twenty second Day of
 of September in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
 and seventy two Whereas I the foregoing mentioned John Getchey in the
 foregoing last Will and Testament did through a mistake mention
 and declare that my son Jacob to whom left my land and
 some other legacies was at the Time of making my said Will,
 and thereby mentioned that he the said Jacob was seventeen
 Years old and ten Months on the said third Day of Septem-
 ber 1772. When in Truth and in Fact he was but sixteen
 Years and ten Months and thus I publish and declare
 to be his true age; and no more.

And I will and upon the following alterations be made in
 the foregoing Will as touch some legacies by me made,
 and that my Executors conform to the same with regard
 to the said alterations viz. First the legacy by me given

of Twelve Pounds to my Son John Getchey and the legacy of five Pounds
 to my Son Frederick which was to be paid to them out of my personal
 Estate before any Division was to be made, I do hereby will and direct
 that the said Legacies be paid to each of my said Sons, by my Son
 Jacob to whom I have given my real Estate, and by him to be acce-
 ptable to each of them as soon as he arrives to the edge of twenty
 one Years and that the said Estate of land be chargeable with
 the same unto them until paid. And I the said John Getchey at
 this Day being of perfect sound mind and memory do hereby
 declare it to be my own Act and Desire the above Codicil and
 Alterations be made and inserted as an Amendment to my said
 last Will and then do declare this Amendment as part of my
 said Will In Witness whereof I have set my Hand and affixed
 my Seal the Day and Year above mentioned,

 Debts & miserable Offsets to be for her use & disposal likewise
 the Care of six or seven Andros & James to maintain of y^e place
 Next I give to my well beloved Son Andrew & my Son James
 the Plantation to be equally divided between them at y^e Judgment
 of four men to be chosen & enjoyed likewise one black
 Mare to my sd Son Andrew & y^e Mare left to his Daughter
 Elizabeth one Indian & Shalton Colt, to my Son James
 And I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all and every
 other former Testaments Wills Legacies & Bequests &
 Executor by me in any Waye before named: ratifying
 & confirming this & no other to be my last Will and
 Testament In Witnes whereof, I have set my hand,
 and Seal the Day & Year above written.

 In the Name of God, Amen. I John Thompson of Rowan
 in the Province of North Carolina, Farmer, being weak of Body, but of
 sound mind and Memory, Thanks be given to God, thinking to end
 the Mortality of the Body, and that it is appointed for a little more
 to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. That
 is to say, principally and first of all, I give and bequeath my Soul
 to Almighty God who gave it, nothing doubting but I shall receive
 the same again reunited to my Body at the general Resurrection by
 the mighty Power of God; and my Body I recommend to the Earth to
 be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the Discretion of
 my Executors: in due Expectation as above mentioned, And as touching
 such worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life
 I give devise and of the same in the following manner and Form. And first
 I allow my lawfull Debts and funeral Charges to be paid out my mor-
 tual Estate. Secondly, I give and bequeath unto Martha my dearly
 loved Wife, her bed and bed clothes, all her wearing apparel, her spinning
 Wheel & Check Reel, and one black Cow, these Things to be sold at her
 own Disposal; and also one Horse to be purchased for her about fourteen
 Pounds, together with her Dress, one brinded Cow, one little Oak Chest, one
 Pot Pan iron Skillet, these Things to be at her command for her life and
 School, during the Term of her natural life, and then to be sold and the
 money thence arising to be equally divided amongst my surviving
 Children - Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son
 Shadrach Thompson one half of the Plantation wherupon I now dwell
 to be laid off on the north End of the said Plantation, including the
 Mill and other Improvements thereon, and it is my Will that my
 Son Shadrach give and also my Wife Martha a comfortable Maintenance
 out of his said Part of sd Plantation during the Time of her natural
 Survivall; I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Thomas
 the other half of the Plantation wherupon I now dwell, to be his
