

In the name of God Amen! State of N. Carolina Rowan County July the 22th 1807. I John Foreman being very weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God, do make this my last will & test: in manners & form as followed viz: that is to say

First of all it is my will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my personal property.

Item it is my will that all my personal property be sold & the money arising from the same to be equally divided between my children, that is to say to Hannah Fisk, Polly Fisk, Catharine Prothrope, Margaret Jones, Barbara Foreman & John Foreman.

Item then it is my will that my land estate be sold & the money arising from the sale be equally divided between my children as aforesaid.

I do hereby constitute & appoint my true & trusty friend Daniel Matisinger executor of this my last will & test: & do hereby rescind all former wills & test: made by me in any way, ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & test:

Carolina being weak of body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to almighty God, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & test: that is to say: principally & first all I give give my soul into the almighty hands of God, who gave it & my body to the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors; nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God & as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life I give & demise & dispose of the same in the following manner. & form.

Item. I give & bequeath to my well beloved son Joseph Long, the plantation whereon I now live, in Rowan County, containing Two hundred & Ninety two acres & also one tract of land in Cabanys County formerly Newburg containing One hundred & fifty acres of land, joining the lands of John Shelhoas & Martin Wister & also one black mare, & all my stock of horse & all my stock of cattle, sheeps & hogs, that I am or may be possessed of at my decease without exception & also all my ~~land~~ ploughs, gears, all my plantation tools of every kind without exception & also all my beds & house hold furniture of every kind that I am or may be possessed of at my decease & also one iron 16th harrow, all which articles I give & bequeath to my beloved son Joseph Long, to him & his heirs forever & also I give to my son Joseph Long all notes
