These things he shall give unto my son Jacob as soon as the said Jacob is married - Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Catharina as wife of Henry Per, one shilling and also one half of the surplus of my moveables not herein bequeathed, or retained by my wife Mary - Item I give & demise unto my son Tobias my plantation of Land which I bought of Adam Corel containing by estimation two hundred acres / to him his heirs & assigns for ever on this condition if he shall live to beget an heir, he shall nevertheless have the use thereof during his life, and if he dies without an heir begotten of his then and in that case the said Land shall by virtue of this my will descend unto my son Jacob & his heirs and assigns forever. On condition that he the said Jacob shall live to beget an heir, and if he shall die without an heir begotten of his body then the said plantation of Land shall descend unto my son Frederick & my daughter Catharina & their heirs & assigns for ever. Also I give & bequeath unto Tobias two cows - Item I give & bequeath unto my son Jacob one horse one new waggon & twelve pounds N. Carolina Currency which he is to receive of my son Michael as aforesaid, and also from my executors the sum of forty eight pounds also

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my waggon makers tools, my large iron oneifle & one half of my moveables (viz.) of the surplus not herein bequeathed or retained by my wife Mary. And I do hereby constitute & appoint my two sons Adam Stijerwalt & Frederick Stijerwalt executors of this my last will & test. And I do hereby make void revoke & disannul all other wills which I have made heretofore ratifying & pronouncing this & no other to be my last will & test: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this tenth day of September in the year of our Lord 1796.
