and Margaret is to have one yellow mare, english blooded
which Mares are to be valued and to be apord of their
shares, and my son George is to have the rifle which is
not to be valued.

And so this my last will & testament I constitute, make
ordain & appoint my sole executors my beloved wife
Margaret Smith & my brother in law David Smith
but if my wife Damarie then her right of execution
shall cease.

of Newbern & State of N Carolina being weak in body but
of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God for the same &
calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain
this my last will & test: That is principally & first of all
I give & recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God
that gave it to my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
decent manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubt
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
not mortal but mortal by the mighty power of God. And as
touching such worldly estate where with it had pleased God
to bless me in this life I give, devise & dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. First I bind to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Smith one Negroe boy named James & two hundred
pounds hard money my young bay mare, saddle & bridle, two
feather beds & furniture, two rows her choice one chest, two pairs
of the greater posts & the other Kitchen necessaries, one glass window
one looking glasse & two parts of the wool glass & cotton blanket
mentioned articles I desire should be for the support of my bel
oved wife while she lives & at her death I desire the remainder
should be equally divided amongst all my children only the
two beds & furniture, one bed & furniture to Rachel Marck &
the other to Jane Smith & the greatest to be equally divided am
ongst my four daughters. Also I give to my beloved son
Robert Smith Fifty pounds hard money more than his prop
ortionate part with the rest of my children, I give him one Negroe
boy by the name of Charles, to be called by two honest men

The value of the negro is to be towards his part with the rest of my children I give to my beloved daughter Margaret Smith one negro girl named Nellie to be valued by two honest men and the value of the negro to be towards her part with the rest of my children I give her one Rose horse saddle & bridle two feather beds & furniture a chest of drawers two cows one third part of the poultry one flax wheel one pot & one third part of the wool & flax & cotton. I give to my beloved son Jesse Smith Five pounds hard money & what he has rec'd I give to my beloved son William Smith one negro boy by the name of Frank to be valued by two honest men & the value of said negro is to be towards his part with the rest of my children & if he refuses to take him at his value I desire he should go to my daughter Jane, as above mentioned I give him my Clock: - The remainder part of my property that not mentioned in this my last will & test. I desire should be valued as above mentioned & the value thereof with the cash & notes I have in hand to be equally divided amongst my eight children only my son John Smith must pay fifty pounds hard money out of his part of my estate for the advantage he had in the land the rest of his brethren & that fifty pounds with all the rest of my estate to be equally divided amongst all my children, Rachel, Midfield, William Smith, Robert Smith, Samuel Smith, John Smith, Elizabeth Moroney Jane Smith, Margaret Smith likewise constitute just & ordain my son Willm Smith and son in law Mr

Many executors of this my last will & test all & singular the above mentioned legacies to my heirs to be freely enjoyed & possessed by them forever. This I desire should be considered as my last will & testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23 Day of June 1800

First I allow my loving son Matthew 16 mrs the voice of the black mare of mine which he sold to James Lewan and the old sorrel mare and her bay filly and the young black colt to his son William and the young son
