
In the NAME of God AMEN Jonathan Hunt of the

1782. Make & ordain this my Last will & Testament  
That is to say principally & first of all I give &  
commend my soul into the hands of God who gave  
all me and for my body I recommend it to the earth  
to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner  
at the Discretion of my Executors nothing lasting

with my wife & Children until the family is  
paired or as long as she continues my Widow then  
sold & Equally divided amongst all my Children  
The Waggon & two Houses to be left on the plan-  
tation for the use of my Family The house-  
hold furniture to be in Care of my wife as long  
as she remains my Widow then to be equally  
divided between her & all my Daughters  
otherwise my will is that after my decease  
all my stock after legacie is paid to be sold

and to be equally divided amongst my Children  
I do hereby appoint & constitute the Rev. Mr.  
William Hill, & my Son Andrew Hunt & Charles  
Hunt my whole sole Executors to this my Last will  
and Testament revoking all others whatever  
ratifying & confirming it to be my last will & testa-  
ment In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &  
affixed my seal the Day & Year above written
