between my brother Benjamin Hilde & Dean Hilde
my sister. Item I give Joseph Thomson my saddlebag
Lastly I nominate Benjamin Hilde as my execr^t.
& confirm this as my last will & test^t; sealed, pub-
lished & pronounced in presence of the subscribers
Abraham Gillon, John Hilde ^{Sealz}
William Cowan.

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Hannale of
Rowan County & State of N Carolina being weak
in body but perfectly sound in mind & memory do
constitute this my last will & test^t; and calling to mind
the mortality of my body & that it is appointed for
all men to die. First of I recommend my soul to God
the great giver & my body to the dust to be buried in
a decent christian manner at the discretion of my
executors & as touching such worldly estate I had
placed god to bless me in this life I give devise &
dispose of the same in following manner & form.

And first of all give & bequeath to my dear & well beloved
wife Mary a certain team more & coll Saddle & bridle
one no hornd cow & calf & two heifers supposed to be with
calf & one spotted cow that Anney claimed to have the
use of them as long as they live together & when she shall
die to me Marcus then she is to have the spotted cow to
herself the small plough & iron the two least ones
& the two least cows & the iron to mend them & all the
furniture that she had when I married her and all that
they can make appear to be hers. Likewise all the beds
& furniture that belongs to them & also the hogs & what
grain there is for the support of the family & stock
until such times the stock is disposed of And I secondly
bequeath to my beloved daughter Sally the sum of thirty
pounds. Thirdly I bequeath to my brother Thomas &
my sister Anna all my claime of lands on the waters of
Lick creek & Jackson creek & on the beaverdam creek
& all the rest of my moveable property except what I have
already given, after my lawfull debts & funeral charges
is paid. & I likewise constitute make & ordain my trusty
friends Hugh Cunningham & John Sloan executors of
this my last will & testament & disclaim & revoke
all other wills by me made in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this 14 February 1797.
