tor to my beloved Sons John McBrown and James McBrown.
Item I give all the dues out of his own Share for the ob-
taining a Title out of the Office for getting Titles for each Bran-
ch District in North Carolina and upon his neglect or
the same then James to take it out & hold the premises
so as to him self. Secondly I give unto my beloved Daughter
Sarah McBrown my Bed & all the Furniture therwards unto
her & her going by all my wearing Apparel. Thirdly I
give unto my Son John McBrown my Bell & all the

in the Province of North Carolina being at present in sound State of
Health, both in Body and Mind & of sound Memory, but being aware
of the uncertainty of human Life, Do make constute and appoint
this my last Will and Testament, in Manner and Form following.
Iprimis I commit my Body to the Earth there to be decently interred
at the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned and my Soul
I leave into the Hands of my great Creator, humbly hoping for
mercy at the Last Day, and my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows.
Item. It is my Will and Desire, that all my just Debts & Expences
of my Funeral should be paid and discharged. Item I give and bequeath
unto Margaret McDowell my nearly beloved Wife, the feather bed
and Furniture one riding Horse & saddle and bridle, to her
use during her life. Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved
Son John McDowell the sum of thirty Pounds for his maintenance & Education

100 Item, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Charles the
sum of five Shillings lawful Money of North Carolina, over and above
what he has already received from me. Item, I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Eliz R. Mc Kinney the sum of five pounds
lawful Money of North Carolina. Item, I give and bequeath unto
my beloved Daughter Hannah Christman the sum of five pounds
lawful Money of North Carolina. Item, I give and bequeath unto
my two younger Sons John and Joseph all the Rest of my real
and personal Estate after their Mothers Estate of the Third is
 deducted to be equally divided in manner following, it is my Will
 that my younger Son Joseph shall possess and enjoy the Tract
 of Land situate on Silver Creek which I purchased from my
 son Charles and even that my Executors shall purchase out of
 my Estate a Tract of Land for my son John to the Value of fifty Pounds
 plus money of North Carolina of the Remainder to be equally divided
 between my two younger Sons John and Joseph and in case either die
 under under Age I appoint the survivor to be his Heir.

Item, I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved Wife
Margaret and Sons Hugh and Charles Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament, and hereby revoke and repeal all
former Wills and Testaments, ratifying and confirming this
to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand & signed and affixed my seal this
sixteenth Day of March, in the Year of our Lord one thousand
four hundred and forty.

Matry a Negro fellow named called Suffa and I am a negro boy to him
and his heires forever Item I give unto my belovd son James Matry
a Negro boy and littale Chamis and full a Negro garle to him and
his heires forever And my Will is that my son James Matry is to
take care of my belovd Daughter Lusa during of her life and
is not to take care of her self. And my Will is further that after
Wifes Durance or the Day of her deaing which
will be in this
that all my houesall goods two featherbeds and founaines and
all my Stock of Horsps and Meas and battaile and Hogs to be had
by my son James Matry by the Money and my Son John
to pay all my just debts rate of that Money I have and the
over pluske to be equally diuided among my Daughters Eliza
nah Jackson and Rustin Carter and Louisa Williams and
Martha Matry and Francis Elio. Witnesse my hand and seal this
fiftenth Day of December 1776. In witness that I give
