at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the gen-
eral Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
I shall be left I give to God to help me in this Life I give a
divid & dispose of the same in the following Manner and Form
Imprimis It is my will and I do ordain that in the first place
of just Debts and funeral Charges be paid & satisfied Then I give
and bequeath unto my Son-in-Law John Draper the sum of five Pounds
I give and bequeath unto my Son Robert Murray the
sum of fifteen Shillings I give & bequeath unto my Son-in-Law William
Birmingham the sum of four Shillings I give & bequeath unto
my Son James Murray the sum of four Shillings I give and be-
queath unto my Son John Murray the sum of four Shillings per anno in
Hilary & then £10. If you the person that had a father £2. I
give & bequeath unto my Grandson Murray £10. one half Mar.
I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Isabella and my other &
what remains of my Estate likewise make provision for my well
beloved Son in Law Samuel Draper and my son John Murray my only & sole Heirress of this my Estate
and I do hereby wholly disclaim moreover by this my last & only
will from a former Testament Wills, Legacies and Bequests by

in every ways befeigned. I inc name & seal of my selfe ratifying and
confirming this to be my last Will & Testament in writing whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal the eighth year above written
In the presence of us.
