

on which I now live consisting two deeds, one from Joseph Luckey the other from Richard Luckey each made to by them also the two mills, grist & saw mill with all their appurtenances, to be his & his only forever. Provided that the same time that the said John Dickey does furnish or allow his mother & younger sisters a sufficient maintenance from the premises before mentioned as long as may be ready residing. 5. I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Shorbrough one Negroe girl named Hannah now in her possession.

6. I give & bequeath to my son William Dickey one tract of land containing 130 acres adjoining to Richard Luckey's land on the west, & others, and that my executors hereafter to be mentioned purchase a addition to said land of sixty acres if it can be had, if not that they furnish him with the price of said sixty acres at three dollars per acre. Also that all my lands & property or money not before mentioned or appropriated, go in to the hands of my executors be sold & divided so as to make my younger daughters Larcas, Alce, Esther, Mary, Nelly equal in property to my daughter now married, if the property thus disposed & divided should at last fail to make the younger equal to the married ones that those now married pay back an equal proportion to bring them equal, or if after said division there should remain some property; that such remainder be equally divided between my two sons John & William.

Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Eleanor & my son John Dickey as the sole executors of this my last

will & test, revoking, & disannulling all & every other will before by me made, ordaining this to be my last will & test. in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23th day of June 1806.

Memorandum of the last will of Mary Dickey May the 24th 1803.

First I give to my beloved son James Dickey one Grindstone one log chain one grape & one iron wedge & one loom & tackling but reserving the use of the loom & tackling for the use of David Dickey while he continues to live on this place.

Secondly. I give to my beloved daughter Margaret Dickey one three year old heifer two sheep of bus & all my house furniture & I appoint my daughter Margaret Dickey to be my executor. Signed, sealed, & delivered this 24th day of May 1803. in the presence.
