

First I will that all my just debts be paid & that my land be divided in equal value, between my two sons William & Joseph so that Willm shall have his part on the north side of the tract, including the dwelling house & other buildings with the improvements adjoining, & Joseph his part on the south side including the meadow & the live stock of horses cattle be equally divided between my daughter Chatarina & the two above named two sons viz to each one third part also my sd daughter Catharina to have the dresses & furniture thereto belonging her bed & furniture & a third part of all the household furniture, the other two thirds & all the remainder of my personal estate, equally divided between my aforesaid sons provided that she shall pay unto my son David twelve pounds the value thereof in saleable property & I do by these presents nominate & appoint my said sons William & Joseph executors of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I the said Joseph Hays have hereunto set my hand this 16 Day of Decbr 1793.

In the name of God Amen! the seventh Day of July 1778 I Moses Hull in the County of Rowan in the province of N. Carolina, Miller, being very sick & weak in body, but of perfect mind & memory Thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed all men one to die. Do make & ordain this my last will & test: that is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of God & as touching such worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in following manner & form. I do give & bequeath unto my beloved son Moses Hull & Joseph Hull my Mill & the land thereunto belonging my son Moses to have all the benefit of the mill till the first day of April next ensuing this Date & then to be equally divided between Moses Hull & Joseph Hull. I do give to my son Moses all my hogs & cattle likewise my gun & a small quantity of land in the east Dearfry in Anwill Township. I do give to my son Joseph my feather bed & bedding, three pewter plates & a bason. All the rest of my estate to be sold at publick sale & the money to be equally divided between Moses & Joseph & if Joseph

die without him his part of my estate to be left to my grandson Joseph Hull. I do give & bequeath to my son Daniel Hull the sum of forty pounds to be paid out of my estate & no more ~~to~~ that to be paid ten pounds ~~again~~ year.

I do appoint Richard Wilson & my son Moses Hull my executors of this my last will & test. & I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all & every other former test, wills, legacies & bequeaths & executors by me in any wise before named, willed & bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & test. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

In the name of God Amen! The 23 day of October 1793. I Robert Hughes of the County of Rowan & State of N.C. Carolina calling to mind my mortality & knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make this my last will & test: my body I commit to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named. And as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it had pleased God to bless me with in this life I give bequeath & demise of in the following manner & form.

First of all my will & pleasure is that all my just debts be paid out of my personal estate in some convenient time

after my decease by my executors hereafter named. Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Jean my sorrel mare & bay horse named Lory, with her wearing apparel & side saddle, one feather bed & furniture, with one plough & tackling with gears for two horses, unto her & her heirs for ever, I likewise allow six cows & three steers for to remain on my plantation, for the support of my children, with all my sheep & hogs, with the remainder of my household furniture & kitchen utensils with two sykes two cranes two hoes, with my negroe girl named Pat, while my wife remain my widow or till my youngest heir come of age & then her & with her I share for to be equally divided amongst all my children with my negroe boy named Samson - to remain on my plantation, if that he behave well, if not that he be sold & the best be made of him for the advantage of my children. Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Cathrin my sorrel colt. Item I bequeath unto my daughter Mary my young colt. Item I give & bequeath unto my four sons & if my wife should be now pregnant with child & if it should be a boy that it have a full part in my land, with the rest of his brethren & if a girl a child's part in my personal property, unto them, Henry John, Robert Wilson & Jacob I bequeath all my land for to be equally divided amongst them unto them & their heirs for ever & all & singular the residue of my estate, to be equally divided amongst my children. Lastly I name & appoint my beloved wife & John Wilson my executors. Signed & sealed by me as my last will & test. in the presence of John Brandon, George Niblack jr Henry Hucker. & Robert Hughes seal.
