

1762 In the Name of God Amen. The twenty first Day of  
Oct. An<sup>d</sup> 1762 William Esteva<sup>n</sup> Dower Planter, and  
Province of North Carolina being sick & weak of Body  
but of sound mind and Memory Thanks be to God for it.  
Caring to mind the Mortality of my Body and that it is appoint  
ed for all men once to die do make & give in this my last Will  
and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give &  
recommend my Soul unto the Hands of God that gave it and my  
Body I command to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and  
desert Manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubt-  
ing but to the generall Resurrection I shall recover the same again  
united to my Soul by the might power of God. and as touching  
such worldly Estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this  
Life I give names & dispart of the same in the following manner.  
And first I appoint & allow all my legal Debts and  
General Charges to be punctually paid out of the whole of my Estate.  
Secondly I bequeath unto my wife beloved Wife one third part of  
all my real and personal Estate & her effects. Thirdly I doth and  
appoint the one half of this Plantation Slaves to fall to my  
Son Robert and to have it in the like the dwelling House to remain  
likewise my said Son & his Children & his Children's  
the other half of the Land to my second son William likewise  
I appoint to allow the Remainder of my personal Estate to be  
equally divided amongst the whole of my Children. Lastly  
I do constitute & appoint my trusty & well beloved Friends  
Andrew Allison & Robert Leckie to be my sole Executors  
of this will & Testament hoping that God will enable them  
to undertake and fulfill the trust I now commit to their charge  
with a good Conscience and I do hereby Disannul break and  
cancel all and every other former Testaments Wills legacies  
and bequests made and Executors by me in any way before  
named willed or bequeathed ratifying & confirming

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and only this to be my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof  
I have set my hand & seal this Day & Year above written

& Richard by William Esteva<sup>n</sup> as

1766 Whereas I Nathan Dicks of the County of Rowan and Province of  
N.C. & C<sup>t</sup> d<sup>r</sup> knowing & considering the great uncertainty  
of life here & thinking it expedient to leave behind me the following Line  
as my last Will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all  
I commend my soul unto the Lord who gave it me and my Body I  
recommend unto the Earth to be buried in a Christian like respect  
Manner at the Discretion of my Friends & Relations. And as  
touching such worldly substance wherewithal the Almighty hath  
blessed me to possess me without I bequeath & dispose & distribute  
thereof in manner & form as follows to wit I desire in the first  
place that all my just Debts be paid. — I give unto James  
Dicks my younger brother that part of my Land lying

James Britton laid off for him by William Milliken with a  
Line beginning near that Branch called the little Branch and runs  
down to the Mouth & crosses the Creek & so into the Line of the whole  
tract - The remaining part of my Land I leave unto my two  
sons Joshua and William equally to be divided between them  
that is to say Joshua is to have the lower part down the Creek &  
William the Improvement I now live on all the remaining part  
of my Estate I give unto my Wife for her support and bringing  
up my Children and to be at her disposal during the time she  
remains my Husband and if she Marries before my Daughters is of  
age I shud desire that two parts of the said remaining Land should  
be equally divided between Sarah Deborah & Grace my two daughters  
And lastly I do in this Constitute & Appoint my loving Wife Mary  
Dick and trusty Friend William Milliken the whole and sole Executor  
of this my last Will & Testament ordering & desiring they may  
execute & perform this my last Will and Testament to the best  
of their Understanding according to the intent and meaning  
thereof And I do hereby revoke all other or former Wills  
testaments or Legacies that may appear in my Name ratifying  
and confirming this to no other In witness whereof I  
hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 27<sup>th</sup> Day of the 10 Mo 1765  
(athaa Dick's last Will and)

1770 May 1<sup>st</sup> In the Name of God I men. In the tenth Day of August  
in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & thirty six I  
William Penny of the Province of North Carolina & County of Orange,  
being weak in Body, but of perfect mind & memory Thanks be to Al-  
mighty God therefore calling to mind of Mortality of my Body, and that  
it is appointed to all Men once to die Do make and ordain this my  
last Will & Testament That is to say first of all I give & recommend my  
Soul to God that gave it, and for my Body I command it to the Earth  
to be buried in a Christian like Manner at y<sup>e</sup> Discretion of my Ex-  
ecutors, nothing doubting but at y<sup>e</sup> general Resurrection I shall  
receive the same again, by the mighty power of God. And as touching  
such worldly Estate as God has been pleased to bless me with in  
this life, I give, bequeath & dispose of y<sup>e</sup> same in y<sup>e</sup> following  
Manner & Form - Imprimis I give & bequeath to my beloved  
Wife Ann the Use of Dina a Negro Woman, while she bears my  
Name; and twenty bushels of Corn & her Rents of Potash  
Yearly & every year; also two hundred weight of Meat and a  
Sufficient Whale and also the Use of a Horse and a Cow. At  
Third Article I allow my beloved Wife Ann, to receive from  
my beloved Son James in y<sup>e</sup> manner specified while she bears  
the promises, in a House which he shall build for her, where it  
will be most convenient both for him and her: and also the Use  
of a bed, but at the Death of my beloved Wife Dina any sum  
is to return to my son James. Atm I give unto my son James  
the Plantation on which I live & his Books and the Negro Tom.  
Atm I give unto my son William my Land in Orange County  
for a Plant & Tackling and one Horse Atm I allow my son  
James to give to each of my Daughters that are now unmarried  
y<sup>e</sup> sum thirty pounds lawful money of North Carolina and a  
Spinning Wheel to be paid in the Manner following: to Daughter  
Hannah one half, that is, fifteen pounds on Year after my  
Decease & other half at the Expiration of two Years after  
Deces.
