I also give & bequeath to my third daughter of eight part of my personal Estate. — I also give & bequeath to my fourth son John the right part of my personal Estate & ten pounds in money which his brother James is to give him if he live until he be fourteen years of age and if he die <sup>before</sup> than I allow it to my fourth son William. I also allow him to be bound to a Trade at the age of fifteen what ever Trade he shall choose. — I also give and bequeath to my fourth son William of eight part of my personal Estate & ten pounds in money to be paid by his brother Hugh when he arrives at the age of fourteen years & if he die before that time than I allow it to my third son John. I also allow him to be bound to what ever Trade he shall choose at the age of fifteen years. — I likewise constitute make and ordain my beloved wife Jean of my brother George Catherby my Executor & Executor of this my last Will & Testament and Samuel Young & certain as overseer over them. And I do hereby utterly repeal all & every Will & Testament by me made before this time naming & confirming this to be my last Will & Testament. Thirdly, all the residue of my worldly Estate, Money, Goods & Chattels real & personal I give & bequeath hereunto unto her my beloved wife Ann Barbara being my true & Executor.
