I give to W<sup>m</sup> Bird, I order that my land shall be sold, & a equal division to be made amongst my children, also I constitute & ordain my son Peter Lewis to be my sole executor of this my last will & test: And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all & every other former test, or wills & executors by me in any way before named written or bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & test.
