 durch anzuzeigen werden, welche für mich auch bey meinen
 guten Verstand verschrieben haben, als nämlich zu dem
 zweyten habe ich meinen Sohn zu haben verschrieben das Gut
 und Luthardt und Spinnmühl, und Rüst und für meine Tochter
 eine Zinn Schüssel, und die feinsten, nützlich Weizen im
 Korn und Glanz soll das sein zugewiesen. Das Leben soll er
 bewahrt werden, und also auch das Vermächtnis, und mein Sohn
 soll wann er feinsten Jahr alt ist zu einem Hundesack ver-
 bunden werden, zu was für einem das er will. Und habe ich
 Martin Kensing den zwey abgemachten Vermächtnissen das
 durch gegeben das Improvisum zu versehen, als an das Mord
 zu einem weisen und einen Herrn für den Leuten, welche ruffen
 bey Zeugen den 31. ten Tag in May 1775. in Lower County N. Carolina

In the name of God Amen! I Philip Ehrenhardt
 of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina being
 in perfect health & of sound mind & understanding but con-
 sidering the uncertainty of this life, do make, publish &
 ordain this to be my last will & test: in manner & form
 as followed.

1. I recommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it
 me, & my body to be buried, in a decent & christian manner
 at the discretion of my executors hereafter named.

2. I give & bequeath to my beloved son John Ehrenhardt
 the one half of the plantation, where I now live on, the lower
 part thereof next to Sander Klinger's man, including the house
 & improvement & the clear ground thereunto belonging so
 as to have the one half of the said plantation.

3. My will is that all the other half of said plantation, after
 my death & all the personable property that I possess at
 that time shall be sold by my executors to the highest bidder
 & giving the usual credit & the money arising therefrom to be
 equally divided among all my children share & share alike,
 as is hereafter named, Mary, Elizabeth, Philip, George &
 John, Christina, Easter, Cave, Ezra Caty, Mary Margaret

4. I do hereby give my executors full power to make
 a good & sufficient title for the said one half of the plan-
 tation to be sold as if I was present myself.

5. I nominate & appoint my beloved & trusty friends -
 Jacob Brougher, & Fredrick Fisher son of Martin Fisher both
 of the County of Rowan & of the State of N. Carolina as
 my executors of this my last will & test:

And I do hereby revoke all former wills or legacies heretofore by me made or done in any wise, ratifying this to be my last will & test. In witness my hand & seal this 14th day of February 1791.

In the name of God Amen! I William Newsens
of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina, being of
sound & perfect mind & memory (blessed be God) Do this 14th
day of November AD 1800. make & publish this my last
will & test: in manner following; that is to say:

1/ I give & bequeath to my loving wife Toney the one half
of my plantation whereon I now live, that is the west end
of said plantation & my white mare & my iron gray colts
coll & two cows & one large plough & tackling, with two
feather beds & furniture glass hackle & spinning wheel one ax
& mattock & my waggons & all my dresser furniture two
iron pots one dutch oven & one skillet.

I also give & bequeath to my loving son James the other half
of my plantation naming the east end with paying all the
present demands that are against my estate, provided they do
not exceed the value of one hundred acres of said land, and
I also allow him one ax & one mattock. & the remaining
part of my plough tackling, one cow & pigs & one sheep.

I also give & bequeath to my loving daughter Ann my black
coll, three cows, one feather bed & furniture, her riding saddle

& bridle & one spinning wheel.

I also give & bequeath to my loving daughter Rebecca one
feather bed & furniture, one young cow, one spinning wheel
& one riding saddle.

I also give & bequeath to my loving daughter Mary one feather
bed & furniture, one red huffer one riding saddle & one spinning wheel.
And all my other property except what is before bequeathed away.
I allow to be sold by my executors, & after my funeral expences
& other accruing charges be paid I allow the remainder of said
amount to be equally divided between my two sons William
& Robert. And is further my pleasure that after my wives decease
her part of my plantation be equally divided between my two
sons the said William & Robert & it is further my will, that
if the said William or Robert should die while they are minors
then I allow their part of my estate to be equally divided
between my female heirs.

And I do hereby make & ordain my wife & my son James
to be my executors of this my last will & test:

my last will & test: set my hand & seal the Day & year
above written.
