State of N^o. Carolina do on this second day of October in the year of
Lord 1787 lay in a very weak low state of Health but of a sound
mind memory & Discretional thanks be to almighty God for his Blessings
& calling to mind the mortality of the Body knowing its approach
for all men once to die and after death to come to judgement I first
do all recommend my soul to almighty God through our Lord Jesus
Christ my body to be decently buried in the earth at the discretion
of my Executors until the great & general resurrection & then have my
body united again by the mighty power of God as to where my
worldly goods as I leave God to keep me with in this life I do in this
my last will & testament give Devise & Dispose of in the manner
& form following Viz First I give & bequeath to my beloved son
Harman Glapcock part of the tract of land now lying on beginning at a rock
at the mouth of my spring branch & running up the various courses of the
fence on the east side of my plantation till it strikes this branch ^{then}
up the various courses of sⁿ branch to Boston Islands line all the
land lying east of the sⁿ line I give to him & his heirs for ever & he
have ~~posse~~ yet after the next crop. Secondly I give & bequeath to my
beloved son Henry Glapcock all the rest & residue of the sⁿ tract
of land to him & his heirs for ever he thus Henry Glapcock
leaving his mother during her natural life Thirdly
I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Glapcock
one fether bed & bedding of the furniture now belonging
to the said bed above mentioned which she now claims in the
