them their heirs & assigns equally. And I do hereby  
empower & authorize my son Thomas Memphis to sell  
& distribute the money arising from the articles  
~~contained~~ contained in this clause according to the  
plain sense & meaning thereof at the first of any  
of the times therein mentioned that may first hap-  
pen. Lastly I nominate appoint & ordain my  
loving wife Susannah Memphis, & Samuel Young  
Executor & Executor of this my last will & testament  
hereby revoking & annulling all other wills beque-  
aths bequests & executors by me in any manner of  
ways before this time named & bequeathed or  
demised ratifying & confirming this & no other to  
be my last will & testament. Signed sealed published

in money. I give & bequeath to my eldest son Samuel  
all my title of that tract of land lying on the north side  
of Richard's creek called Isaac Davis place and  
ten pounds in money if he takes up my bond if  
he does not the land is to be sold & the money to be di-  
vided amongst the rest of my children. I give and  
bequeath to my son David Partly eight shillings.  
I give to my son John one pound more & fifty pence  
in money. I give to my daughter Margaret eight  
shillings. I give to my daughter Elizabeth one black  
cow & one further bed & furniture. I give to my daugh-  
ter Catherine one spotted heifer & three sheep. I give to  
my daughter Mary one red cow with a white face  
I give to my daughter Rachel one bundle Cows.  
I give & bequeath to my three sons Robert William  
& Walter all the remainder of my lands together

122) with the home plantation after they come to the  
years of twenty I am to be equally divided  
amongst them if either of them should die  
before they come of age it shall fall to the others  
they all these are to be bound to traders of their own  
choosing. I give to my grandson Robert Bartly  
Five pounds when he comes of age. I will that  
the mill & the land belonging to it and also  
the residue of my estate to be sold and equally  
divided amongst my four daughters and  
grandson Elizabeth Cutton Mary Rachel &  
Robert Todd. I will that part of that shall be  
give to my grandson Robert Todd in fee simple  
what is allowed sufficient, and I do hereby  
declare this & this alone to be my last will &  
testament and do constitute & appoint Benja-  
min Todd & Cuth Todd Executors thereof in  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &

ed will to him his heirs & assigns forever. 3<sup>d</sup> I give &  
bequeath unto my son Hugh one Negro wench nam-  
ed Doll to him his heirs & assigns forever. 4<sup>th</sup> I give &  
bequeath unto my Daughter Lean one Negro  
wench named Rust & my saddle & all my wearing  
apparel. 5<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath unto my two Sons  
John & Hugh Parks my two Bibles. 6 I give &  
bequeath unto my grand daughter Margaret
