ter and Tea Ware and silver Spoons, *MM* I do give
and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Phoebe the other
half of all my dresser and Dresser furniture and Tea
Ware and silver Tea Spoons also her saddle & bridle
and my black Mare and a Red Horse also her bed
and furniture and a large Iron Kettle and her
spinning wheel and a coarse hatchel *And*
I do give and bequeath to my other ^{two beloved} Daughters
Elizabeth & Martha each of them a good Bed coverlet
also my Books I do order and allow to be equally
Divided amongst all my Children, I further
nominate and ~~appoint~~ constitute and ordain
my trusty and well Beloved Brother in law
William Hart & Archr. McNulty to be my only

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and sole Executors of this my last Will and
Testament and I do hereby ratify and confirm
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament

Carolina, the weak in body yet of sound mind
& Memory do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in form and manner following
Viz. first I freely resign my soul to God who gave
it and my Body to the Priest to be buried
in a Christian Burial place at the discretion

of my Executors, and then all my personal Charges
and lawfull debts to be discharged and paid and the
Residue of what God has blessed me with to be disposed of in
the form following. FIRST I give and Bequeath to my
true and loving Wife Martha Moore, the Bay Mare &
her Saddle and her Bed and furniture thereto belong-
ing, over and above her right of dower and my Land
or Real Estate to Equally divided between my four
Sons, William Robert, George, and Joseph upon their
giving to each of their Sisters, Mary, Elizabeth & Martha
a Cow and Calf when they Arrive to the age of Seven
Years old, and the personal Estate, except the above
Requests to be equally divided between my three
Daughters, Mary, Elizabeth and Martha, and I do
appoint constitute and appoint Martha Moore my
true and loving Wife and Joseph Cunningham my
heir and well beloved Brother to Execute this my
Will, In witness whereof I do publish pronounce
and declare this and no other to be my last Will
and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Affixed my seal this 6th day
of Sept. One thousand seven hundred & twenty nine
signed sealed, published and declared in the presence of
Robert Simcocks Alex^r. Miller &
Anderson Smith. Jas. Smith Jun^r Robert Moore

This being my last will and Testament

all my lands to be divided Equally between them the
Entire Land to be divided out of the Stock, to my
two Daughters, I bequeath that is to Maria and
Ann Allison 1500 pounds each, the Negro Bunch
and her Children, Likewise the Stock to be sold by
Public Vendor and divided equally among the
Children, These particulars I pronounced to be
my last Will before these Witnesses this 12th
day of February in the Year of our Lord 1780
