County of Carolina, being sick in body, but of good & perfect memory,
wishes to be to Almighty God, & calling to remembrance the
uncertainty of this transitory life, do make & declare
my last will & test: in manner & form following.

I will & bequeath unto my beloved son John Barkley
all my real & personal estate.

I will & bequeath unto my dearly beloved daughter Eliza
Godine her bed room & furniture & likewise her maintenance
out of the profits of my plantation, whilst she remains
unmarried & chooses to live with my son John Barkley.

I will & bequeath unto my dearly beloved son Samuel
Barkley the one half of my waggon & of my wheat

I will & bequeath unto my dearly beloved daughter
Margaret Donaldson one cow & calf or the value of
a calf in cash, at the expiration of two full years after
my decease.

I will & bequeath, unto each one of the heirs of my
deceased daughter Catharina Berry deceased the sum of £5
fifteen shillings. And I hereby make & constitute my
dear friend Thomas King, & my son John Barkley full
executors of this my last will & test. hereby revoking
disannulling all former wills & bequests by me made.

I declare this only my last will & test. In witness
whereunto I have hereunto set my hand & seal, the day & year above
written, read, pronounced & declared
