

My last Will and Testament, That is to say principally and
first of all I give and Recommend soul to Almighty God gave He
and for my body I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian
like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again reunited to my soul by the mighty Power of God and as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
me in this life, I do give devise and Dispose of the same in the
following manner and form.

First. It is my Will and I order that all and singular
my just Debts and funeral Charges be paid and satisfied.

Secondly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Brother
Archibald Mc Nulty the sum of Thirteen pounds four Shillings
in Money also my Mare and Mares, and likewise my Saddle.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved James
Mc Nulty the sum of thirteen pounds four Shillings.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Brother James
Mc Nulty the like sum of thirteen pounds four Shillings and
likewise my blue suit of Cloaths and two Buckskin Breeches.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Brother John
Mc Nulty my Stout Coach.

Sixthly. It is my Will and I order that my Carpenter and Joiner Tools
be sold and the Money there arising be Equally Divided amongst
my three Brothers Viz. Arch. Mc Nulty James Mc Nulty & James
Mc Nulty. I do ordain and appoint, my Trusty Brother John
Mc Nulty and Archibald Mc Nulty To be my Executors of this
Testament, and I do hereby fully direct

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Archie and Samuel all and every other former Testaments made
by me and executed in any way before this time named, made
and bequeathed ratifying and confirming them and no other to be my
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal the day and year aforesaid.

hundred and seventy five I Samuel Rasebrough of the County
of Rowan and Province of North Carolina being sick and weak in
Body but of sound mind and perfect Memory (mind and Memory Thanks
be given) before Calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make
and make this my last will and Testament, that is to say principally
and first of all I give and Recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God, that governs and my body unto the Earth to be
Buried in a Decent manner at the discretion of my Executors, not
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and
bequeath Dispose in the following manner and form.

First. I give and bequeath unto my well
beloved Brother and sister belonging

308 Bay Mares of three years Old and her Saddle and the one third part
of the Remaining part of my Estate. Second. I leave and bequeath
under my will be fore Son Samuel the other two parts of my estate,
and I allow all my Estate both the Plantation and moveables
to be sold at publick sale, and I allow all my just and legal Debts to
be paid of the whole Head of my estate.

Lastly I appointed over and appointed my two Brothers John
Rosebrough and William Rosebrough and ordain them to be my
lawful Executors and I do hereby disannul all other former wills
and Testaments and I make this to be last will and Testa-
ment in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the day
year above written.

living Rooms before signed.

May 1775 } I Thomas Milton in Row County in North Carolina
on the waters of Abits Creek being but weeks of Body but

death make this as my last Will and Testament making void all
other wills or Wills Legacies whatsoever made or done before by word
or writing (and this taking for my last will and Testament first
I allow my Body to be decently buried by Executors hereafter
named next all my just Debts to be paid, first I bequeath to my
Wife Jean Milton her Bed and Board & Cloaths also her spinning
wheel & wooden Vessels of all kinds and one horse
the largest Excepted also what more

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which now is the Horse or Mare Jane & one both of her own
choosing such as in my possession at my Death also her own Saddle.
I allow my Son George one hundred and forty one Acres of Land on
pole Creek adjoining Old Powell and not to touch the Creek the
Remainder to be Divided in two equal parts, and then two Head
Enjoys these two last is to keep their Mothers Cow and Horse or mare
Winter and Summer at their Cost also to build her a sufficient House
or Cabin on such part of the Land as she shall think fit most
proper also find her every Year during her widowhood two hundred
weight of sufficient Meat also twenty five Bushels of grain
such as she will choose, also but and hall her ~~and~~ plenty of ~~and~~ fire
wood Every Year further I allow my Son George within to pay twelve Months
after my decease to pay my Son John Milton whom with my wife I
appointed Executors and provide Proclamation Money also the two that enjoy the
other part four years after my Death to pay each John Milton two
Cows also my land on Abits Creek to be Divided in two
to be given to two such as I or father shall name at his de-
time & them two shall pay my son John Eighteen years
two Cows with Calf each one year I allow my Goods not im-
turned into Money to Deed the land in Abits Creek and if any

I allow my Son John Milton four pounds twelve Months after my
decease; I will and allow to my Son Jack my largest Iron, both
Iron Crook & Foot hooks and after my the Land is Deeded and all
Legacies paid the same shall be Equally divided amongst all my
Children. Dated this 23. day of the 8. Month 1775.
