

94. In the name of God Amen! I Thomas Munroe
of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina being sick
& weak of body but of sound mind & perfect memory
do make & ordain to be my last will & testament, in the
following manner Viz. Item I will & bequeath unto
my beloved wife Amelia Munroe my plantation on
the Yadkin River together with six negroes knowing
by the following names, Jack, Sunday, Peter, Minnie,
Pinah & Phibe, all the stock of horses cattle, sheep
hogs except as such as is hereinafter mentioned the new
waggon all the implements of farming the crops now
growing & all the grains & provisions on hand, all the
household furniture except as is hereinafter mentioned
during her natural life, & then it is my will that the
negroes with their increase together with their other
property, go unto my daughter Rebecca Leaguan Munroe
to her & her heirs forever.

Item I will & bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Rebecca Leaguan Munroe, my plantation & Mill
on Sandy creek, together with seven Negroes knowing
by the following names, Rachael, Sam, Delia, Hannah,
Britt, Adam, & Natt three beds & furniture her riding
horse saddle & bridle, my riding mare & her colt.

Item I will that the remaining part of property may
be equally divided between my wife & daughter before mentioned.
I appoint & constitute my trusty friend Charles F.
Bagge to be my executor & my wife Amelia Munroe to

In the name of God Amen! I Robert McKie the Elder of
the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina, being weak
in body but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be unto
for his mercies calling to mind the mortality of my body
& knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make
& ordain this my last will & testament. Principally & first
of all I give & bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave
it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
decent christian manner, at the discretion of my executors
nothing doubting but I shall again receive the same at
the general resurrection by the mighty power of God. As
touching the worldly estate wherewith it had pleased God to
bless me in this life I give & dispose of it in the following
First I give & bequeath unto my beloved sons Robert McKie
& Phedon McKie all the tract of land whereon I now live
& whereon they also live containing about three hun-
dred acres for which I have already made them a deed
to be equally divided between them. If they can not agree
upon the division of it themselves it should be my desire
that the whole tract should be divided into two equal parts
by a east & west line leaving each of them an equal number
of acres, & the two divisions to be valued by sponorable men
of judgment the one has the most valuable part, paying to
