Fifthly I give & bequeath to my daughter Rachel one year old mare colt Sixthly I give & bequeath to my daughter Hannah one white faced cow & calf. And for the better bringing this my last will & test: into execution I do name & appoint my beloved Son George Willis & my well beloved son in law Hazel Molland the whole & sole executors of this my last will & test: Revoking & disannulling all other wills by me heretofore made, constituting this only to be my last will & test, In witness of which I have hereunto set my hand & seal & pronounce it to be my last will & testament in the presence of the subscribing witnesses who in the presence of Ed Thom Willis subscribed their names as

In the name of God Amen! Know ye that I Thom Womack of the State of N Carolina & County of Rowan am sick & weak in body though of perfect mind & memory. Do hereby constitute & appoint this my last will & testament and desire that it may be received as such by all that it may concern. First I give & bequeath my soul to God who gave it to me, & commit my body to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named in full assurance of its resurrection from thence when time shall be no more And as for my worldly goods I do ordain & constitute that all my lawfull debts be justly paid.

Secondly. I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Sarah Womack my grey colt; one feather bed & furniture one loom & the gears belonging thereto, one cow & calf. Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my dearly beloved children, named, Sarah, ~~Elizabeth~~, William, Richard, Jesse, Bird, Eppoy Womack all my stock of horses cows, sheeps & hogs to be equally divided amongst my said children, to have as their property likewise I give & bequeath to my beloved sons Abraham Womack William Womack, Richard, Jesse, Bird & Eppoy as aforesaid one feather bed & furniture for price for each of them to have as their property, likewise I give & bequeath to my beloved children as before named all my other household & kitchen furniture to be equally divided amongst themselves their property

likewise I give to my son Archibald Wommack ten shillings to be raised out of my estate.

And I do hereby constitute & appoint Abraham Wommack & Willm Wommack my true & trusty friends to be executors of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I do hereby set my hand & seal 8. October 1799.

I John Walker of Rowan County being weak in body & knowing that all men must die. Do make & ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will & test in manner & form as followed:

First my will is that all my just debts be paid by my executor here after named.

Secondly for my body to be decently entred by the Executors

Thirdly I do give & bequeath to my two sons Moses & John Walker five shillings each they have had their proper part previous to this time,

Fourthly I do give & bequeath to my son William Walker, one hundred & fifty acres of land, lying on the waters of Sucassee branch of Turkey Creek in Philotas County in the State of South Carolina & further I give to my son Willm the balance of the bond on Daniel Dolt together with a bond on

Saint Smith.

Fifthly I do give & bequeath to my three daughters viz Rebecca Rachel & Agnes one shilling each & after all is settled what ever part of my personal estate is left I give & bequeath to my son William Walker.

And lastly I do constitute & appoint John Haley of Guilford County to be my executor giving him full power & authority to execute this my last will & testament in confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20. of Novbr 1803.
