In the Name of God Amen. I Walter Carnuth of Pennsylvania
in the Province of North Carolina being sick & weak of Body
but of sound Mind & Memory. Thanks be given to God thereof: Caring
to wind the Mortality of the Body and that it is appointed for all
Men once to die. Do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament
That is to say principally & first of all I give & bequeath my pre-
cious Soul unto God who gave it, & my mortal Body I commend
to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian Manner, at the
Discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same rewards to my Soul by the
mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly Goods
as God hath been pleased to bless me with in this life, I give, demise
& bequeath the same in the following manner & Form.

First. I allow all my lawful Debts & funeral Charges to be duly
paid, for which purpose, let so much of my Crop & Stock be
sold as may suffice to pay the same, & the Remainder to be dispo-
sed of as herein after mentioned. Secondly. I give & bequeath unto
my wife beloved Son James Carnuth, all that Part of my Lands
lying on the East side of Little Creek, together with my or
Smart, now in his possession, & one half of the Waggon: he paying
one half of the Charges of repairing her, and also paying to
Robert Brown or his Order the sum of five Pounds currency
when demanded. Thirdly. I give & bequeath unto my wife be-
loved Son John Carnuth the other Part of my Lands and
Tenements lying on the West Side of said Creek together with
one Negro viz. Mills and the other half of the Waggon, also one
Black Horse called Junch & one Bay Mare called Kips, two Corn
one half of all my Household Furniture, and my share in the
Library, he paying to Robert Brown five pounds currency
when demanded. Fourthly. I give & bequeath to my wife beloved
Daughter Agnes Carnuth the other half of all my Household
Goods & Furniture together with one large grey Horse and
two Cows & also five pounds out of my or Smart's share

(whom I allow to be sold) And Fifthly I give & bequeath unto my wife
beloved Daughters Anna Campbell & Sarah Kerley the Remainder of my
movable Estate together with the Remainder of the Negroes since to be
equally divided between them. And lastly I do hereby nominate Con-
stituted & appoint my wife beloved Son James Carnuth & John Carnuth,
Executors of this my last Will & Testament, under the Inspection of my
trusty Friends James Huggins & my beloved Son John Kerley, rat-
ifying & confirming this & as often to be my last Will & Testament.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this eighth
Day of February in the Year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven
hundred & sixty nine.

August 21st In the Name of God Amen. I Isaac Croyenburgh weak in
but of sound judgement & Memory blessed be God for it and caring to
mind that it is appointed for all men once to die I first commit my
Soul to God who gave it, and my Body to the Dust to be decently buried
at the Charge of my wife Estate in general, and dispose of my Estate
as hereinafter mentioned. I allow that all just & lawful Debts be paid
of my whole Estate in general and next I bequeath unto my loving
Daughter Margaret Croyenburgh five shillings, and to each one of her living
two now living twenty shillings, one pair of these Quakers unto her
Son David & one pair of these Buttons to her Daughter Hannah. To
my wife beloved James Croyenburgh I bequeath and also five shillings
to be paid out of my last years Schooting which I left in his hands
to collect & the Remainder to his Son David In the most place I bequeath
