In the name of God Amen I Wm. Brown of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina, being of a perfect & sound memory, though of a weak & frail body & calling to mind, that it is appointed for all men once to die, do constitute & appoint this my last will & testament, revoking & disannulling all other heretofore made by me: Injunctive I give my body to the ground from whence it was taken & recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God to seeking his most gracious acceptance of it: as to my burial, I desire it may be made decent without pomp or pride according to the discretion of my executors, here after named, & as to this worldly estate, it had being the almighty's pleasure to bestow upon me I will & desire in manner following. I will that all my just debt, be justly paid before my estate be distributed.

I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Margaret Brown my improvement where I now live, & all my household furniture, my sheeps, my work horses, nine heads of cattle & my hogs & my plantation, working tools during her natural life. I give & bequeath to my daughter Charity Robson one shilling sterling & that is all I will give her. I give & bequeath to my son Wm. Brown, one sound horse & that is all I give to him. I give & bequeath to my son Lamer Brown one horse & that is all I give him. I give & bequeath to my daughter Constant Wynn one Cow & that is all I give her. I give & bequeath to my daughter Susanah Brown one Cow & that is all I give her. I give & bequeath to my daughter Elisabeth Brown one Cow & that is all I shall give her. I give & bequeath to my daughter Margaret Brown one cow & one young lamb & that is all I give her. I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Margaret Brown the daughter of Susannah Brown one heffer & calf & that is all I give to her. The remainder of my estate if there be any left, I give it to the disposal of my wife Margaret. I do hereby through the force & good will, I bear to my well beloved Grand Henry Strange, appoint him with my well beloved wife Margaret Brown as executors of this my last will & test: depending on their faithful discharge. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 9th day of February in the year of our Lord 1792.
