Lastly I make & ordain my sons John, William & David Cowan joint executors of this my last will & test: In witness whereof I the said Mary Cowan have to this my last will & test: set my hand & seal the day & year above written, Signed, sealed & published in the presence of us.

 possession of my dwelling room & other necessary priviledges
 of my dwelling house during her widowhood I give to my wife
 a small pot, bason & 6 spoons.

2. I give & bequeath unto my son George my plantation
 & dwelling where I now live for ever, but shall comply with
 the following condition (to wit) he the said son George shall
 find feed for his mothers creatures as I have given her & he
 the said son shall find his mother yearly with sufficient
 wheat, corn, & meat during her widowhood & shall also find
 her shoes & stockings yearly during her widowhood then if my said
