 of this my last Will Testament Ordering & desiring they may
 do execute & perform this my last Will and Testament with the best
 of their Understanding according to the Intent and meaning
 thereof. And I do hereby revoke all other or former Wills
 Testaments or Legacies that may appear in my Name ratifying
 and confirming this & no other. In Witness whereof I

 in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & seventy
 William Conry of the province of North Carolina & County of Rowan,
 being sick in Body, but of perfect mind & memory, Thanks be to all-
 mighty God therefore calling to mind of mortality of G^d Body, and that
 it is appointed for all men once to die. I do make and ordain this my
 last Will & Testament. That is to say, I do give & recommend my
 Soul to God that gave it, and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth
 to be buried in a Christian like Manner at G^d Direction of my Ex-
 ecutors, nothing doubting but altho' general Resurrection shall
 receive the same again, by the mighty power of G^d. And as touch-
 ing such worldly Estate as God has been pleased to bless me with in
 this life, I give, bequeath & dispose of G^d same in G^d following
 Manner & Form: - In primis I give & bequeath to my beloved
 Wife Ann the Use of Dina a Negro Maids, while she bears my
 Name; and twenty Bushels of Corn & ten Bushels of Wheat
 yearly & every Year; also two hundred weight of Meat and a
 suspension of Salt and also the Use of a Horse and a Cow. All
 these Articles I allow my beloved Wife Ann, to receive from
 my beloved son James in G^d manner specified which she lives upon
 the promise, in a House which he shall build for her, where it
 will be most convenient both for him and her; and also the Use
 of a Cow, but at the Death of my beloved Wife, Dina a Negro Maids
 is to return to my Son James. I do give unto my son James
 the plantation on which I live & his Tools and the Negro Tom.
 I do give unto my son William my Land in Orange County
 & a Horse & Tackling and one Horse more. I also my Son
 James to give to each of my Daughters that are now unmarried
 G^d sum thirty pounds lawful money of North Carolina and a
 spinning Wheel to be paid in the Manner following: to Daughter
 Hannah one half, that is, fifteen pounds one Year after my
 decease, & the other half at the Expiration of two Years after
 my decease.

 Decree. To Daughter Anne one half that is, fifteen pounds, at
 the Expiration of three Years after my Decese, & the other half at
 the Expiration of four Years after my Decese. To Daughter Jane
 one half at the Expiration of five Years & the other half viz. fifteen
 pounds at the Expiration of six Years. I allow my Debts to be
 Collected and my moveable Goods such as I have not disposed
 of above, and the Debts which I have contracted to be fully paid
 of what remains, I allow my Daughter Catharine the sum of thirty
 Shillings lawful Money of North Carolina. Also to my Daughter
 Margaret, of sum of twenty Shillings lawful money of North Carolina.
 And if any remains I allow my Son William to have it. But if
 any of my Children die without Issue of their Body lawfully be-
 gotten, his or her Inheritance thus bequeathed shall be equally divided
 among the Survivors of my Children now at home.
 I make constitute & ordain my beloved Wife Ann, and my Sons
 James and William, whole & sole Executors of this my last
 Will & Testament. And I do hereby revoke all & every other
 former Will & Testament, and I do by this present confirm
 this to be my last Will & Testament as Witness my hand
 & seal this thirteenth Day of August in y^e Year of our
 Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty seven
