

168 In the Name of God, I, William Steel, the twenty ninth Day of September in the Year  
May 1773 of our Lord our thousand seven hundred and seventy three, I William Steel  
of the County of Rowan and Province of North Carolina, being very sick  
and weak in Body, but of perfect Mind and Memory, Thanks be given unto  
God for the same, and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body, and  
knowing that it is a Sickness for all men once to die, do make and  
ordain this my last Will and Testament: That is to say, principally &  
last but of all I give and recommend my Soul into the Hands of God  
that gave it, and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth, to be buried  
in a Christian like and decent Manner, at the Discretion of my Execu-  
tor, nothing hindering out at the general Resurrection, I shall receive  
the same again by the mighty Power of God; and as touching such  
mortally Estate wherewithal I have placed God to help me in this Life, I  
give and bequeath of the same in the Manner and Form following:  
That is to say — In the first place I give and bequeath to Elizabeth,  
my dearly beloved Wife, the third Part of all my personal Estate and  
Furniture together with the Use and sole Proprietary of my dwelling House  
and Lot in the Town of Salisbury during her natural life and at  
her death to fall to my Son John Steel and his Heirs and Assigns  
forever, I likewise do give and bequeath for the Use of one  
Negro Wench named Bridget and her four Children until my Son  
John comes to full Age, and then they are to be his, I likewise do  
will & bequeath that she may have the Use of the Negroe Money  
in her own Hands free of paying any Interest until each of  
them respectively comes to full Age. I also give and bequeath  
unto my well beloved Daughter in Law Margaret Gillespie two hun-  
dred & fifty Pounds proclamation Money, which money is to be  
taught and paid out of my personal Estate. I also give and  
bequeath to my well beloved ~~Son~~ Son in Law Robert Gillespie  
two hundred and fifty Pounds proclamation Money to be  
taught & paid out of my personal Estate, likewise

I also give and bequeath to my only Son  
Jacob of two hundred and thirty five acres  
of Salisbury, also sixteen Lots of Land aforesaid  
in the said Town and one <sup>lot</sup> Lot No 2 in the Town  
Buildings and Improvements theron. Likewise  
unto my said Son John one Negro Wench named Ann  
Children together with her Incomes and likewise all the in-  
personal Estate, and if it should happen that my said Son  
should die before he comes to full Age, then and in that Case the one half  
or moiety of the real & personal Estate hereby willed to him to be equally  
equally divided between my Daughter in Law and Daughter in Law Margaret  
and Robert Gillespie, Slave and Slave alike and the other remaining Part to  
be equally divided between my Brother John Steele four Children Slave  
Slave alike or the Survival of them. I likewise constitute make &  
name my will below Mrs Elizabeth, together with my trustees, relatives  
Friends Matthew Troy and Marcellus Chambers my only and sole Execut-  
or of this my last Will & Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, ren-  
ounce and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills and Legacies,  
Bequests and Executors, by me in any Way before this Time named,  
willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this, and no other  
to be my last Will and Testament. Witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my Hand and Seal the Day and Year first above written —  
Signed, sealed and published  
pronounced and declared by the said  
William Steel, as his last Will and  
Testament, in the presence of us
