

July 1827 — Wills. —

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan McKinney two hundred dollars worth of property which Susan McKinney and Susan has already received from me and must be put in as part of their part for portions of my estate at the division, which I do give to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William McKinney one hundred and ten dollars worth of property which he has already received from me, and must be deducted from his portion of my estate at the division of my estate; the part that is coming to him I give to him and his heirs forever. —

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Thomas McIntire one hundred and eighty four dollars worth of property which he has already received of me and must be deducted from his portion at the division of my estate. The part that will come to him I give to him and his heirs forever. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Josiah McIntire two hundred dollars worth of property which he has already received of me and must be deducted from his part of my estate at the division. —

Item. I give and bequeath to Jacob Wolf two hundred dollars worth of property in consequence of his intermarriage with my daughter Nancy McIntire which two hundred dollars shall be considered that much of his portion that is coming from my estate. —

Item. If any thing is coming to my daughter Nancy Wolf at the division of my estate I lend the same to the said Nancy Wolf, during her life and at her death I give the same to her heirs, that is of her body to have and to hold forever. —

Wills — July Court 1827

Item. My will and desire is, that the Children that now live with me as soon as they come of age or marry shall have two hundred dollars worth of property as those have that has left me and upon the same conditions that they shall account for the same and be considered as part of their proportion of my estate in like manner as those that have left me. —

Item. I will and allow and devise that no part or parts of this my last will and testament be altered. —

Item. And lastly I ordain and allow and appoint William Covington and Bird McIntire executors of this my last will and testament, revoking all other wills, gifts, legacies or bequests by me, and this only to be my last will and testament. — In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven. —

5th I leave and bequeath to my son William Groves one sound mare that he now owns with a saddle and bridle with five head of Cattle and eleven head of hogs that he now owns. -

6th I leave and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars with one bed and furniture, one wheel and one pair of Cords one cow and calf. -

7th I leave and bequeath to my son George M. Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars with one cow and calf and one sow and pigs. -

8th I leave and bequeath to my son James A. Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars with one cow and calf and one sow and pigs. -

9th I leave and bequeath unto my son Andrew Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars with one cow and calf and one sow and pigs. -

10th I leave and bequeath to my daughter Sarah B. Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars one bed and furniture, one cow and calf with one wheel and Cords. -

11 I leave and bequeath unto my son Nelson M. Groves one horse saddle and bridle worth twenty dollars with one cow and calf and one sow and pigs. -

12th I allow at the death of my wife all the land that I now own to be equally divided by volition among my five sons William, George, James Andrew and Nelson Groves. -

13th I allow my cotton machine with one waggon one still, one set of Smiths tools and one sound horse to be sold at public sale, and when the said money is collected to be equally divided among my five youngest sons when they come of age. -

Will - May Court 1827.

I appoint, constitute and ordain my beloved wife Nancy and son Jesse Groves, Executors for this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby disavow revoke and disannul all other former testament Will, legacies, bequeathed or entered by me in any Will made or done, ratifying and confirming this and none but this to be my last Will and Testament. - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of April one thousand eight and twenty seven. -
