

The will of Crenshaw Camp was recorded in Will Book B, 1791 to 1813, page 220, Rutherford County, North Carolina. It was proved in the October Court, 1808. From the wording of the will he was apparently unmarried. The will reads as follows:

In the name of God Amen, I Crenshaw Camp of North Carolina and Rutherford County being of sound & perfect mind & memory (blessed be God, Do this 22 day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and eight, Make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say -- First I give & bequeath to my brother George Camp my Negro boy Embra and All that part of my Camp fork track of land that lies east of the old waggon road & two rifle guns and all my working tools & half my legacy from my Father's Estate in consequence of which he must pay to my Sister Ruth Camp two hundred fifty Dollars or a Negro Girl of that value within two years after my decease, and to my Brother Stephen Camp fifty dollars in trade within the said two years, my working tools and guns, he is to sell as so much thereof as will pay my debts I owe, and to my Brother Joshua Camp I Give and bequeath all that part of my Campfork tract of land that lies west of the sd Old Waggon Road Including the Improvement & My Cotton Gin & half the work of the machine And that fifty acre track of land on Floyds Creek Which I got a title of Peter Fisher for with all the privilege I am entitled to according to contract between Aron Camp and me and half my Legacy From my Father's Estate in consequence of which He must pay my friend & Brother Samuel Broadway or family fifty Dollars in trade within Two years after my Decease. And unto my Brother Aaron Camp I give and bequeath that track of Land whereon he lives containing by Estimation one hundred acres &

my Saddle. And I hereby make & ordain my Brothers George Camp & Joshua Camp Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I said Crenshaw Camp have set my hand & seal the Day above written.

Signed, sealed, published and Declared by the sd Crenshaw Camp the testator as his last Will & Testament in the presents of and who were present at the signing and sealing thereof.
