John Baber and George Blackwell.

The will of Stephen Camp was recorded in Book E, page 259, February Court 1846, Rutherford County, North Carolina. It reads:

In the name of God Amen. I Stephen Camp being of sound mind and memory do hereby constitute and make this my last will and Testament Revoking & anulling all other wills, heretofore made by me. Item First, I bequeath my body to the Earth from whence it originated and my sould to God who gave it. Item 2. In consideration as it has pleased God to Endow me with some of the worldly goods of this world and haveing given unto David K. Fisher and my Daughter Julia his wife and my son George C. Camp their part of my Estate heretofore I now devise and give the balance of my Estate or property to my other four children (viz) Eliza Green, Elias A. Camp, Adam S. Camp and William C. Camp to be equally divided between them at my decease after paying all my just debts -- Signed sealed this 14th day of December A.D. 1845. I appoint Adam S. Camp my Executor.
