And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give & demise and dispose of in the following manner & form (viz) first of all I give my son William (camp the tract of land which he now lives on containing One hundred & forty acres more or less Beginning on a large Red Oak near second Broad Street with my old line to a White Oak & thence to Black Oak & from thence to Chestnut & from thence to the upper corner of my old house, thence to the beginning, also one Cow & Calf (twice) a Red Cow & a Reddy, give unto my daughter Amy Kester one bed & furniture I give unto my son George Johnston all the ballance of my land either by Deed or Patent, two feather beds & furniture two Hens, all the ballance of my flock of cattle & all my stock of Hogs & sheep, my tools of every description all my household and kitchen furniture I leave my son George Johnston and Amy Kester as my lawful Executors ratifying this to be my last will & testament and no
