Cattle not heretofore named. It is my further will

and desire that my tract or parcel of lands that
has heretofore constituted a part of what was known
by the name of the Crook Road tract, ~~it~~ being a piece
of land that Kinchen Wall bought of William
Gross containing between 120 and 140 acres, be
sold, and the proceeds of said sale applied to the
payment of debts that is due from Kinchen Wall
to Alfred ~~Wickham~~ and Anna Deprins for
which I stand bound if any balance be left
after these debts are satisfied, said balance to go to
the use of said Kinchen Wall.

I further constitute and appoint my sons
Hartwell Wall and Willis Wall executors to this
my last Will and testament.

I acknowledge the above to be my last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and ~~affixed~~ my seal this
August the 6th in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty two.

James Geffey being very sick and weak of body
but of perfect mind and memory, blessed be God, and
calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make &
ordain this my last Will and testament, that is to say
principally and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hand of Almighty God who gave
it and my body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly
estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this
life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form to wit:

Item 1st — I give and bequeath unto Martha
Geffey my well beloved wife one third part of
my real estate with my dwelling house during her
natural life, and my sorrel horse, her saddle, one
choice bed and sufficient furniture the walnut chest,
one small oven, hooks and lid, one small pot &
hooks and the bake pan, one new Coffee pot, her
choice of the Cupboard and dresser more, the fire
shovel and tongs, forty one yards of new tow cloth
and ten dozen of boker flax, the large soap trough
and soap and three sitting chairs, the table, her
flax wheel and Cotton Cards, one stone jar
the large water pail, her flax hatchel, the looking
glass and flat iron, the yarn of fifteen yards of
shirting, to be by her freely enjoyed forever.

Item 2nd — I give and bequeath unto my two
sons John and James my plantation to be equally

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divided between them, to my son John the upper part and to my son James the lower part including the milk house and spring.

Item 3^d That my two sons John and James pay to my daughter Jenny E. Hoppiss one hundred and fifty dollars each.

Item 4th That if my wife Martha Guffey wish not to keep the horse, I want my executors to make the said horse in good order and make sale of him and give the price of him in cash to the said Martha Guffey.

Item 5th That the remainder of my property be sold and the money of the same equally divided among my three children John and James Guffey and Jenny E. Hoppiss.

Item 6th I do hereby appoint, nominate & ordain my son John Guffey and Samuel Hoppiss executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disannul, revoke and disallow all former wills and testaments by me heretofore made, ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above mentioned.

I Moses Henderson of the State of North Carolina Rutherford County being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God. I do this 28th day of August in the year of our Lord 1832 make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say. First I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Nancy Henderson all my goods, lands, Chattels and tenements during the term of time she remains my widow, excepting the property herein named which I give and bequeath to the children herein named. Item. I give and bequeath to my son Philip Henderson one rifle gun and ten dollars now due on Joseph Black's wharves collected, one horse Colt and ten head of hogs now in his claim and one heifer calf and 100 Cms of land at the time his mother ceases from being my widow or decedes at the time he comes of age.

Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Providence Henderson one good feather bed and good furniture of her own make, and two heifer quarters now in her possession and five dollars in money - any perishable property left to the children here named if lost by any accident shall be their own loss and not be made up out of the other property, and I hereby at the time she Nancy Henderson ceases to be my widow for all other property of my estate to be equally divided between all my children. And I hereby make and ordain my wife Nancy Henderson and John Smith executors of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I the said Moses Henderson
