I Joseph Hamilton of the State of North Carolina and Rutherford County being of sound disposing mind and understanding (thanks be to God for the same) do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner & following that is to say First, I give and bequeath unto my sister Letty M. Ginniff wife of Robert M. Ginniff of Tennessee four negroes viz Unity and her two children, a negro girl named Luecky now in the possession of the said Robert M. Ginniff also two hundred dollars to be paid to her by my Executors out of my estate as soon as may be convenient for them to do so. Second I give and bequeath unto my sister Fanny Martin wife of Richard Martin a negro girl named Nancy now in the possession of the said Richard Martin. I also give and bequeath unto my said sister Fanny the sum of one hundred dollars and it is my will and desire that the same be paid out to interest by my Executors on good landed security and the interest thereof to be paid to her annually during her life, and after her death to be divided between her children share & share alike. Third I also give and devise unto my beloved wife during her natural life my plantation or tract of land on Sandy Run wherein I now live during her natural life also six negroes viz. Nancy & her two sons that is Ben, George and Prince, also Charlotte daughter to Abby and Beckey daughter to Silby during her natural life and after the decease of her my said wife I give and bequeath the the aforementioned Land & Negroes to my two daughters Sarah & Mary and their heirs forever to be equally divided between them share and share alike. Fourth I also further give and bequeath to my said wife Nancy all my household

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furniture farming utensils and stock of every kind, my Cotton gin and Sulkay except such articles as are herein after specifically given to my two daughters. I further give and bequeath to my said wife One thousand dollars to be paid out of my Estate as soon as can be conveniently done by my Executors. Also I give & devise unto my daughter Sarah my house and lots in Rutherfordton and one hundred acres of Land which I purchased of the Executors Andrew Brooks to her & her heirs forever, further I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Sarah the negroes following to wit Daniel, Robert, Rose and her five children named Beck, Arthur, Leifka, Eliza and Jeda, Mary and her wife Rhoda and three children named Rosanna, little Mose, and George. Also I give and bequeath unto my said daughter Sarah all such sum or sums of money goods debts and profits as may be due to or in any wise coming to me from the Concern of James M. Erwin & Company or the partnership now existing between him and me on the dissolution of our Copartnership, also one large looking Glass and three feather beds & furniture. I also give and devise unto my daughter Mary my plantation on Mountain Creek now under lease, to her and her heirs forever. I also give and bequeath unto my said daughter Mary the following Negroes (to wit) Cubit, Henry, Robert, Abby, Austin Clarissa and her child Adeline, William, John, big Silby, little Silby, Levi and Harrison, also one bureau three beds and furniture. I also leave and bequeath to my friend Dr. Charles Schuffelin my thermometer, I also leave and bequeath all my wearing apparel and clothing to my brother Amos Hamilton. And lastly I do hereby ordain and appoint my trusty friend John M. Bowles my trusty & loving brother Medley Hamilton and my beloved wife Nancy Hamilton all of Rutherford County to be my executors of this my last Will & Testament not doubting but they shall & will faithfully and

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I humbly execute this my last will and testament and do hereby revoke & make void all former & other wills or wills by me made at any any time hitherto and do declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord 1824. Signed, sealed, delivered and published by the above Joseph Hamilton the Testator in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence have subscribed our names as Witnesses.

I prescribe my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid out of my personal estate and the residue of my personal property of every kind, and my real estate I leave to my wife Mary Collings during her widowhood, except a feather bed and furniture which I now bequeath to my daughter Susanna, and at the death or marriage of my said wife it is my will that all the estate both real and personal be valued by my three children Hezekiah Collings Ira Collings and Susanna Collings if they can agree; and if not let each one choose one disinterested person to value the estate both real & personal and divide equally between the aforesaid Hezekiah, Ira, and Susanna share & share alike, my sons Hezekiah and Ira to take the real estate

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and my daughter Susanna's share to made out of the personal estate if there should be enough for the purpose, if not, the balance to made up to her in money by the other two legates. And I do hereby nominate constitute and name two sons Hezekiah Collings and Ira Collings Executors of this my last will and testament and I the said Watson Collings do publish pronounce and declare this to be my last will and testament, and hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of June 1824.
