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furniture which she now has in possession and all the rest that I have heretofore given her, to her and her heirs forever.

10th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Suttle all my tract of land on Murren Creek in Adams County Tennessee State during her natural life and then to be equally divided amongst the heirs of her body, to them and their heirs forever.

11th I give and bequeath to my daughter, Mary Suttle, & William Suttle my grand son, & sons of sons of Mary Suttle a negro girl named Irene and her increase, which said girl is now in possession of Mary Suttle to them and their heirs forever.

12th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Irene Suttle a negro girl to be bought at two hundred dollars by my executors and her increase to her & her heirs forever.

13th Now my Will and desire is that my land lie undivided until after my wife's death and then be equally divided between my four sons Nathan Hamrick, David Hamrick, William Hamrick & Lorenzo D. Hamrick & they shall call together four discreet men to each one fourth in value to them and their heirs forever.

14th All the rest and residue of my estate not herein before mentioned, at the end of four years to be valued and divided so as to make the negroes that have been given to Jeremiah Hamrick, Nathan Hamrick, David Hamrick, William Hamrick, Lorenzo D. Hamrick, Nancy Hamrick, Sarah Magness, & Narcissa Hamrick equal in value to them & their heirs forever.

15th After my wife's decease I give to Nathan Hamrick the negro woman Hannah, to David Hamrick, I give the negro boy Harry and to Narcissa the Negro man Spencer to them & their heirs

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forever; all the rest and residue of the estate left to my wife except the land to be equally divided between my three daughters Nancy Hamrick, Sarah Magness and Narcissa Hamrick to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I make and ordain my two sons David Hamrick & William Hamrick executors to this my last Will and Testament.

I do hereby certify that the said Nathan Hamrick have to this my last Will and testament at my hand seal the day and year above written.

And after my son John Twitty Miller gets two beds and furniture that my daughter Susannah Lowry & Betty Croton have each of them a bed and furniture, then I dispose of in good conscience I do before my God And I do by these presents nominate constitute and appoint my son in law Isaac Croton and my friend Theodorick Birchall Executors of this my last Will and Testament ratifying this and this only to be my last
